**Bill Summary:** The bill amends Ordinance Code Chapter 602 – Ethics Code – to create a new Section 602.408 that would prohibit former appointed officials [insert "(defined by Sec. 602.201 in part as "any person appointed to any board, commission or authority")] required to file Form 1 state financial disclosures from being employed by, lobbying or consulting for compensation with the board, commission, agency or council of which they were formerly a member for a period of 2 years after they vacate their former office. The bill lists the 12 boards and commissions covered by the lobbying/consulting prohibition.

**Background Information:** State law currently prohibits elected officials from lobbying (for compensation) the body of which they were a member for a period of 2 years after they leave that office. The law does not have a similar prohibition on lobbying for persons who were appointed rather than elected to boards and commissions. This bill would extend the [add "local"] lobbying prohibition to appointed as well as elected officials, and would add a prohibition against former board or commission members being employed by or hired by their former agency to perform lobbying or consulting services during the 2 year period.

The 12 covered boards/commissions include: Planning Commission; Building Codes Adjustment Board; COJ Retirement System Board of Trustees; Police and Fire Pension Fund Board of Trustees; DIA/Northbank CRA/ Southbank CRA; Jacksonville Health Facilities Authority; JEA board; Jacksonville Aviation Authority board; Jacksonville Transportation Authority board; Jacksonville Housing Authority board; Jacksonville Port Authority board; Jacksonville Ethics Commission.
