AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 780.403 (ADDITIONAL HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION AUTHORIZED), (ADDITIONAL HOMESTEAD PART 4 EXEMPTION), CHAPTER 780 (PROPERTY TAX), ORDINANCE CODE, TO INCREASE THE AMOUNT OF HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION FOR THOSE LOW INCOME PERSONS 65 AND OVER FROM \$25,000 TO \$50,000 CONSISTENT WITH STATE LAW; DIRECTING THE COUNCIL LEGISLATIVE SERVICES DIVISION UPON ENACTMENT OF THIS ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE A COPY OF THIS ORDINANCE TO THE DUVAL COUNTY PROPERTY APPRAISER'S OFFICE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 6(d), Florida Constitution, authorizes the State Legislature to enact a general law allowing local governments, for the purpose of their respective tax levies, to grant additional homestead exemptions; and

WHEREAS, Section 196.075, Florida Statutes, implementing Article VII, Section 6(d), Florida Constitution, allows for two additional homestead exemptions for low income seniors; and

WHEREAS, one of the homestead exemptions allowed by the State would apply to a person 65 years or older who has legal or equitable title to real estate and resides on the property if

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certain income limitations are met as described in Section 196.075,
 Florida Statutes, and would allow the additional homestead
 exemption of up to \$50,000; and

WHEREAS, the City Council enacted Section 780.403 of the Ordinance Code, which allows for the above referenced homestead exemption but provided a limitation of up to \$25,000 for the homestead exemption; and

8 WHEREAS, the Council now desires to increase the additional 9 homestead exemption from \$25,000 to \$50,000 consistent with the 10 provisions and limitations of Article VII, Section 6(d), Florida 11 Constitution, and Section 196.075, Florida Statutes; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

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Section 1. Amending Section 780.403 (Additional homestead
exemption authorized), Chapter 780 (Property Tax), Ordinance Code.
Section 780.403 (Additional homestead exemption authorized),
Chapter 780 (Property Tax), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to
read as follows:

CHAPTER 780. PROPERTY TAX.

* * *

PART 4. ADDITIONAL HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION.

* * *

Sec. 780.403. Additional homestead exemption authorized.

Commencing January 1, 2000 2021 and annually thereafter, 23 (a) 24 pursuant to Article VII, Section 6(d), Florida Constitution, 196.075, Florida 25 Section Statutes, an additional and homestead exemption of \$25,000 \$50,000 is hereby authorized 26 for any person who has the legal or equitable title to real 27 estate and maintains thereon the permanent residence of the 28 owner, who has attained the age of 65 and whose household 29 income does not exceed low income as defined by \$196.075, 30 31 Florida Statutes.

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(b) Commencing January 1, 2014 and annually thereafter, 1 2 pursuant to Article VII, Section 6(d), Florida Constitution 3 196.075, Florida Statutes, an and Section additional homestead exemption is authorized equal to the assessed value 4 5 of the property to any person who has the legal or equitable title to real estate with a just value less than two hundred 6 7 and fifty thousand dollars and who has maintained thereon the permanent residence of the owner for not less than twenty-8 five years and who has attained age sixty-five and whose 9 household income does not exceed the income limitation 10 prescribed in §196.075, Florida Statutes. 11

12 Section 2. Direction to Circulate. The City Council 13 Legislative Services Division is hereby directed, upon enactment of 14 this ordinance, to provide a copy of this ordinance to the Duval 15 County Property Appraiser's office.

16 Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become 17 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 18 without the Mayor's signature.
