2 3 The funding above is appropriated from the Litter Trust Fund, Section 111.786, Ordinance Code.

The purpose of the appropriation in 4 Section 2. Purpose. 5 Section 1 is to provide for the authorized expenditure of the civil fines and penalties revenue. Pursuant to Section 111.786, Ordinance 6 7 (\$69,483.46) of the revenue is to be used by the Code, 70% 8 Jacksonville Transportation Authority (JTA) to keep public bus 9 stops and public bus shelters well maintained and litter free, as 10 set forth in written criteria adopted by JTA for that purpose. The remaining 30% (\$29,778.62) is to be used to pay part-time code 11 enforcement employees for public right-of-way enforcement and to 12 conduct public awareness and education programs to advance zero-13 tolerance for litter. 14

Section 3. Report required. The Chief of 15 Municipal Code Compliance Division shall make a report annually to the City 16 17 Council concerning the utilization of these funds, including therein the nature of public awareness and education programs to 18 19 advance zero-tolerance of litter, the status of enforcement efforts, and staffing levels and needs. 20

21 Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become 22 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 23 without the Mayor's signature.
