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## ORDINANCE 2020-219

AMENDING AN ORDINANCE SECTION 121.105 RIGHTS UPON REEMPLOYMENT (PENSIONER'S CITY), PART 1 (POLICE AND FIRE PENSION FUND ADMINISTRATION), 121 CHAPTER (POLICE FIREFIGHTERS PENSION PLAN), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ADD PROVISIONS FOR TEMPORARY POLICE OFFICERS AND FIRE FIGHTERS; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS; WAIVING, PURSUANT TO GOVERNOR DESANTIS' EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 20-52, THE REQUIREMENT IN STATE LAW AND CHAPTER 121 (POLICE AND FIREFIGHTERS PENSION PLAN), PART (POLICE AND FIRE PENSION FUND ADMINISTRATION), SECTION 121.104 (REVIEW OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION), ORDINANCE CODE; EMERGENCY REQUESTING PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Amending Section 121.105 (Pensioner's rights upon reemployment by City), Ordinance Code. Section 121.105 (Pensioner's rights upon reemployment by City), Part 1 (Police and Fire Pension Fund Administration), Chapter 121, (Police and Firefighters Pension Plan), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to

1 read as follows: 2 Chapter 121. POLICE AND FIREFIGHTERS PENSION PLAN. 3 PART 1. POLICE AND FIRE PENSION FUND ADMINISTRATION. 4 5 6 Sec. 121.105. - Pensioner's rights upon reemployment by City. 7 8 (e) The provisions of subsection (a) through (c) shall not apply to 9 the re-employment of any pensioner retiree of the Jacksonville 10 Police and Fire Pension Fund as a temporary police officer or 11 temporary fire fighter if: (1) the re-employment assists the emergency response 12 13 associated with Emergency Executive Proclamation 2020-001 issued by the Mayor on March 13, 2020; and 14 15 (2) in the case of temporary police officers, the Sheriff has determined that the Emergency has caused, or is likely to 16 cause, a significant reduction in the number of full-time 17 police officers available for duty and temporary police 18 officers are needed to provide sufficient law enforcement 19 20 and police services to the City of Jacksonville; or 21 (3) in the case of temporary fire fighters, the Director/Fire 22 Chief has determined that the Emergency has caused, or is 23 likely to cause, a significant reduction in the number of 24 full-time fire fighters available for duty and temporary 25 fire fighters needed to provide adequate Fire and Rescue 26 services to the City of Jacksonville. 27 The re-employment of such pensioner retirees shall be at the pleasure of the Sheriff for temporary police officers and the 28 29 Director/Fire Chief for temporary fire fighters, and may continue until sixty days after the expiration of Emergency Executive 30 Proclamation 2020-001, or any extension thereof.

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To be eligible for re-employment as a temporary police officer, a pensioner retiree must have a current Florida Department of Law Enforcement law enforcement officer certification. To be eligible for re-employment as a temporary fire fighter, a pensioner retiree must have a current Florida fire fighter and emergency medical technician certification.

Being employed as a temporary police officer or temporary fire

fighter shall not prevent a pensioner retiree of this pension plan from continuing to receive such retirement benefits as would be available pursuant to the pension plan had the retiree not been reemployed as a temporary police officer or temporary fire fighter. Being employed as a temporary police officer or temporary fire fighter pursuant to this subsection (e) shall not permit or require a pensioner retiree of this plan to be a member of the pension plan created pursuant to this Chapter 121 or a member of one of the pension plans created by Part II or III of Chapter 120. Being employed as a temporary police officer or temporary fire fighter pursuant to this subsection (e) shall not permit a pensioner retiree to acquire or accrue any rights or benefits provided to active and employed Members of this pension plan created pursuant to Chapter 121 or any one of the pension plans created by pursuant to Part II or Part III of Chapter 120, including but not limited to, rights or benefits regarding time-service credits and benefits, disability, death, DROP, etc.

Section 2. Codification Instructions. The Codifier and the Office of General Counsel are authorized to make all chapter and division "tables of contents" consistent with the changes set forth herein. Such editorial changes and any others necessary to

make the *Ordinance Code* consistent with the intent of this legislation are approved and directed herein, and changes to the *Ordinance Code* shall be made forthwith and when inconsistencies are discovered.

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Section 3. Waiver, Pursuant to Governor DeSantis' Executive Order Number 20-52, of requirement contained in Section 112.63(3), Florida Statutes, Chapter 121 (Police and Firefighters Plan), Part 1 (Police and Fire Pension Pension Administration), Section 121.104 (Review of proposed legislation), Ordinance Code. Pursuant to Governor DeSantis' Executive Order Number 20-52, the City hereby waives the requirement in Section 112.63(3), Florida Statutes, Chapter 121 (Police and Firefighters 1 (Police Pension Plan), Part and Fire Pension Administration), Section 121.104 (Review of proposed legislation), Ordinance Code, that requires an actuarial report accompany proposed legislation concerning the Police and Fire Pension Fund together with recommendations and comments from the State Division of Retirement. This waiver is necessary because, due to the COVID-19 emergency, the City must have the immediate ability to hire temporary police officers and temporary fire fighters to ensure adequate police and fire and rescue services to the citizens of Jacksonville. However, the City will file any actuarial report required by law concerning the Police and Fire Pension Fund as soon as practicable.

pursuant to Council Rule 4.901. Emergency passage of this legislation upon introduction is requested. The nature of the emergency is that the immediate ability to hire temporary police officers and temporary fire fighters is needed for the City's COVID-19 emergency response associated with Emergency Executive Proclamation 2020-001 issued by the Mayor on March 13, 2020.

1 Section 5. Effective Date.
