Section 1. Amending Section 121.105 (Pensioner's rights

20	officers are needed to provide sufficient law enforcement

22	(3) in the case of temporary fire fighters, the Director/Fire
23	Chief has determined that the Emergency has caused, or is
24	likely to cause, a significant reduction in the number of
25	full-time fire fighters available for duty and temporary
26	fire fighters needed to provide adequate Fire and Rescue
27	services to the City of Jacksonville.
28	The re-employment of such pensioner retirees shall be at the
29	pleasure of the Sheriff for temporary police officers and the
30	Director/Fire Chief for temporary fire fighters, and may continue
31	until sixty days after the expiration of Emergency Executive

Proclamation 2020-001, or any extension thereof.

To be eligible for re-employment as a temporary police officer, a pensioner retiree must have a current Florida Department of Law Enforcement law enforcement officer certification. To be eligible for re-employment as a temporary fire fighter, a pensioner retiree must have a current Florida fire fighter and emergency medical technician certification.

10 Being employed as a temporary police officer or temporary fire 11 fighter shall not prevent a pensioner retiree of this pension plan 12 from continuing to receive such retirement benefits as would be 13 available pursuant to the pension plan had the retiree not been reemployed as a temporary police officer or temporary fire fighter. 14 15 Being employed as a temporary police officer or temporary fire 16 fighter pursuant to this subsection (e) shall not permit or require 17 a pensioner retiree of this plan to be a member of the pension plan created pursuant to this Chapter 121 or a member of one of the 18 pension plans created by Part II or III of Chapter 120. 19 Being 20 employed as a temporary police officer or temporary fire fighter 21 pursuant to this subsection (e) shall not permit a pensioner 22 retiree to acquire or accrue any rights or benefits provided to 23 active and employed Members of this pension plan created pursuant 24 to Chapter 121 or any one of the pension plans created by pursuant to Part II or Part III of Chapter 120, including but not limited 25 26 to, rights or benefits regarding time-service credits and benefits, 27 disability, death, DROP, etc.

1 forth herein. Such editorial changes and any others necessary to 2 make the Ordinance Code consistent with the intent of this 3 legislation are approved and directed herein, and changes to the 4 Ordinance Code shall be made forthwith and when inconsistencies are 5 discovered.

Waiver, to 6 Section 3. Pursuant Governor DeSantis' 7 Executive Order Number 20-52, of requirement contained in Section 112.63(3), Florida Statutes, Chapter 121 (Police and Firefighters 8 9 Pension Plan), Part 1 (Police and Fire Pension Fund Administration), Section 121.104 (Review of proposed legislation), 10 11 Ordinance Code. Pursuant to Governor DeSantis' Executive Order Number 20-52, the City hereby waives the requirement in Section 12 112.63(3), Florida Statutes, Chapter 121 (Police and Firefighters 13 Plan), 1 14 Part (Police and Fire Pension Pension Fund Administration), Section 121.104 (Review of proposed legislation), 15 16 Ordinance Code, that requires an actuarial report accompany 17 proposed legislation concerning the Police and Fire Pension Fund together with recommendations and comments from the State Division 18 19 of Retirement. This waiver is necessary because, due to the COVID-20 19 emergency, the City must have the immediate ability to hire 21 temporary police officers and temporary fire fighters to ensure 22 adequate police and fire and rescue services to the citizens of 23 Jacksonville. However, the City will file any actuarial report 24 required by law concerning the Police and Fire Pension Fund as soon 25 as practicable.

Section 4. Requesting Emergency Passage upon Introduction pursuant to Council Rule 4.901. Emergency passage of this legislation upon introduction is requested. The nature of the emergency is that the immediate ability to hire temporary police officers and temporary fire fighters is needed for the City's COVID-19 emergency response associated with Emergency Executive
