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ORDINANCE 2020-139-E

AN ORDINANCE REGARDING CHAPTER 307 (HISTORIC PRESERVATION), ORDINANCE CODE; DESIGNATING THE INDEPENDENT LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY BUILDING, LOCATED AT 233 W. DUVAL STREET, IN COUNCIL DISTRICT 7, AS A LOCAL LANDMARK, PURSUANT TO APPLICATION LM-20-01; DIRECTING THE CHIEF OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES TO NOTIFY THE APPLICANT, THE PROPERTY OWNER, AND THE PROPERTY APPRAISER OF THE LOCAL LANDMARK DESIGNATION, AND TO RECORD THE LOCAL LANDMARK DESIGNATION IN THE OFFICIAL RECORDS OF DUVAL COUNTY; DIRECTING THE ZONING ADMINISTRATOR TO ENTER THE LOCAL DESIGNATION ON THE ZONING ATLAS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Council enacted Chapter 307 (Historic Preservation), Ordinance Code, and determined therein that the preservation, protection, enhancement, perpetuation and use of landmarks, landmark sites and historic districts is a public necessity because they have special historic, archaeological, aesthetic or cultural interest and value; and

WHEREAS, the proposed local landmark, pursuant to Application LM-20-01, On File with the Legislative Services Division, is the Independent Life Insurance Company Building, located at 233 W. Duval Street, in Council District 7; and

WHEREAS, Application LM-20-01 was filed by the owner of the Independent Life Insurance Company Building, and the owner supports the proposed local landmark designation; and

WHEREAS, the Independent Life Insurance Company Building was one of the largest in Florida at the time and the most important commercial building constructed in the City of Jacksonville during the 1950s; and

WHEREAS, the Independent Life Insurance Company Building was completed in 1955 and was Jacksonville's second modern skyscraper and a forerunner to other skyscrapers that followed in the 1950s and 1960s; and

WHEREAS, the Independent Life Insurance Company Building was designed by KBJ Architects, Inc., a leading Florida architecture firm since the end of World War II, which designed 17 of Jacksonville's tallest buildings and responsible for creating the City's modern skyline; and

WHEREAS, the 2016 National Register District Nomination for Downtown Jacksonville recognized the Independent Life Insurance Company Building as one of Jacksonville's landmarks, noting the original design as remarkably intact and timeless; and

WHEREAS, the Independent Life Insurance Company Building is suitable for preservation as an important historic landmark; and

WHEREAS, the Council finds that the Independent Life Insurance Company Building meets five (5) of the seven (7) criteria required for local landmark designation, as more particularly described in the Staff Report of the Planning and Development Department (Staff Report), On File with the Legislative Services Division; and

WHEREAS, on January 22, 2020, the Jacksonville Historic Preservation Commission reviewed and recommended approval of the proposed local landmark designation; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the requirements of Chapter 307 (Historic

Preservation), Ordinance Code, the Council has reviewed the proposed local landmark designation, taking into consideration its importance and historical value, as more fully set forth in Application LM-20-01 and the Staff Report; and

WHEREAS, all public notice and public hearing requirements have been met for designating the Independent Life Insurance Company Building as a local landmark; and

WHEREAS, having met the requisite criteria, the Council finds that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Jacksonville to designate the Independent Life Insurance Company Building as a local landmark, in furtherance of historic preservation and protection; now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Designation of Local Landmark. Pursuant to Chapter 307 (Historic Preservation), Ordinance Code, the Council hereby designates the Independent Life Insurance Company Building, located at 233 W. Duval Street, in Council District 7, as a local landmark.

Section 2. Satisfaction of Requisite Criteria. The Council hereby finds that the Independent Life Insurance Company Building meets five (5) of the seven (7) criteria for designation as a local landmark, pursuant to Section 307.104(j), Ordinance Code, and adopts Application LM-20-01 and the Staff Report in support of this finding, both On File with the Legislative Services Division.

Section 3. Notice and Recording. Pursuant to Section 307.104(m), Ordinance Code, the Council hereby directs the Chief of Legislative Services, as designee of the Council Secretary, to notify the applicant, the property owner, and the Property Appraiser of the local landmark designation, and to record the local landmark designation in the official records of Duval County,

Florida.

Section 4. Zoning Atlas. Pursuant to Section 307.104(n), Ordinance Code, the Council hereby directs the Zoning Administrator, as designee of the Director of the Planning and Development Department, to enter the local landmark designation on the Zoning Atlas, in accordance with Section 656.203, Ordinance Code.

Section 5. Effective Date. The enactment of this ordinance shall be deemed to constitute a quasi-judicial action of the City Council and shall become effective upon signature by the Council President and Council Secretary.
