Introduced by the Council President at the 1 request of the 2 Jacksonville Historic Preservation Commission: 3 4 ORDINANCE 2020-140-E 5 AN ORDINANCE REGARDING CHAPTER 307 6 (HISTORIC 7 PRESERVATION), ORDINANCE CODE; DESIGNATING THE GARDEN CLUB OF JACKSONVILLE, LOCATED AT 1005 8 RIVERSIDE AVENUE, IN COUNCIL DISTRICT 14, AS A 9 LOCAL LANDMARK, PURSUANT TO APPLICATION LM-19-10 11 03; DIRECTING THE CHIEF OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES TO NOTIFY THE APPLICANT, THE PROPERTY OWNER, AND 12 THE PROPERTY APPRAISER OF THE LOCAL LANDMARK 13 DESIGNATION, AND TO RECORD THE LOCAL LANDMARK 14 15 DESIGNATION IN THE OFFICIAL RECORDS OF DUVAL COUNTY; DIRECTING THE ZONING ADMINISTRATOR TO 16 ENTER THE LOCAL LANDMARK DESIGNATION ON THE 17 18 ZONING ATLAS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 19 20 WHEREAS, the Council enacted Chapter 307 (Historic

20 WHEREAS, the council enacted chapter 307 (Historic 21 Preservation), Ordinance Code, and determined therein that the 22 preservation, protection, enhancement, perpetuation and use of 23 landmarks, landmark sites and historic districts is a public 24 necessity because they have special historic, archaeological, 25 aesthetic or cultural interest and value; and

WHEREAS, the proposed local landmark, pursuant to Application LM-19-03, On File with the Legislative Services Division, is the Garden Club of Jacksonville, located at 1005 Riverside Avenue, in Council District 14; and

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WHEREAS, Application LM-19-03 was filed by the owner of the

Garden Club of Jacksonville, and the owner supports the proposed 1 local landmark designation; and

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3 WHEREAS, the Garden Club of Jacksonville was formed in 1922 4 and since has an unmatched record of community service regarding 5 beautification, park improvement, environmental preservation, 6 planning, as well as floral and horticulture education and 7 promotion in the City of Jacksonville for nearly one hundred years; 8 and

9 WHEREAS, the Garden Club of Jacksonville has been most active 10 and successful in the area of education and promotion of gardening 11 and horticulture among Jacksonville's diverse population, receiving 12 recognition for national programs and activities among 13 Jacksonville's youth, particularly those with special needs who 14 participate in "garden therapy"; and

15 WHEREAS, in 1949, the Garden Club of Jacksonville had 2300 16 members and at the time was recognized as the largest garden club 17 in the world; and

18 WHEREAS, the Garden Club of Jacksonville complex consists of 19 two buildings, the Garden Club Room, constructed in 1947 and 20 designed by notable Jacksonville architect Russell Seymour, and the 21 Auditorium Building, constructed in 1958 and designed by the 22 prominent Jacksonville architectural firm Saxelbye & Powell; and

23 WHEREAS, the Garden Club Room and the Auditorium Building have 24 all of their original windows, doors, and columns, as well as, wall 25 and roof treatments, reflecting the original character and 26 defining features of the buildings; and

27 WHEREAS, the Garden Club of Jacksonville is suitable for 28 preservation as an important cultural landmark; and

29 WHEREAS, the Council finds that the Garden Club of 30 Jacksonville meets five (5) of the seven (7) criteria required for 31 local landmark designation, as more particularly described in the

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Staff Report of the Planning and Development Department (Staff
Report), On File with the Legislative Services Division; and

3 WHEREAS, on January 22, 2020, the Jacksonville Historic 4 Preservation Commission reviewed and recommended approval of the 5 proposed local landmark designation; and

6 WHEREAS, pursuant to the requirements of Chapter 307 (Historic 7 Preservation), Ordinance Code, the Council has reviewed the 8 proposed local landmark designation, taking into consideration its 9 importance and historical value, as more fully set forth in 10 Application LM-19-03 and the Staff Report; and

WHEREAS, all public notice and public hearing requirements have been met for designating the Garden Club of Jacksonville as a local landmark; and

WHEREAS, having met the requisite criteria, the Council finds that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Jacksonville to designate the Garden Club of Jacksonville as a local landmark, in furtherance of historic preservation and protection; now, therefore

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

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20 Section 1. Designation of Local Landmark. Pursuant to 21 Chapter 307 (Historic Preservation), Ordinance Code, the Council 22 hereby designates the Garden Club of Jacksonville, located at 1005 23 Riverside Avenue, in Council District 14, as a local landmark.

24 Section 2. Satisfaction of Requisite Criteria. The 25 Council hereby finds that the Garden Club of Jacksonville meets 26 five (5) of the seven (7) criteria for designation as a local 27 landmark, pursuant to Section 307.104(j), Ordinance Code, and 28 adopts Application LM-19-03 and the Staff Report in support of this 29 finding, both **On File** with the Legislative Services Division.

30Section 3.Notice and Recording.Pursuant to Section31307.104(m), Ordinance Code, the Council hereby directs the Chief of

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Legislative Services, as designee of the Council Secretary, to notify the applicant, the property owner, and the Property Appraiser of the local landmark designation, and to record the local landmark designation in the official records of Duval County, Florida.

6 Section 4. Zoning Atlas. Pursuant to Section 307.104(n), 7 Ordinance Code, the Council hereby directs the Zoning Administrator, as designee of the Director of the Planning and 8 9 Development Department, to enter the local landmark designation on 10 the Zoning Atlas, in accordance with Section 656.203, Ordinance 11 Code.

12 Section 5. Effective Date. The enactment of this 13 ordinance shall be deemed to constitute a quasi-judicial action of 14 the City Council and shall become effective upon signature by the 15 Council President and Council Secretary.
