Introduced by Council President Wilson, Pursuant to Section 118.804 1 2 and at the Request of the Public Service Grant Council: 3 4 5 ORDINANCE 2020-218-E AN ORDINANCE REGARDING CHAPTER 118 6 (CITY 7 GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE; ESTABLISHING THE 2020-2021 CATEGORIES MOST VULNERABLE OF 8 PERSONS AND NEEDS FOR PUBLIC SERVICE GRANT 9 APPROPRIATIONS; REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY 10 11 PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 12 WHEREAS, the Public Service Grant Council met on February 12, 13 2020 to approve the Fiscal Year 2020-2021 Most Vulnerable Persons 14 15 and Needs, a copy of the minutes of said meeting are attached 16 hereto as **Exhibit 1**; and 17 WHEREAS, the City Council through this ordinance is hereby 18 establishing the Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs for the 2020-19 2021 Fiscal Year; now therefore 20 BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville: 21 Section 1. Categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and 22 Needs Established. Pursuant to Section 118.804, (Categories of 23 Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs), Ordinance Code, the following 24 categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs, as recommended by the Public Service Grant Council in the letter attached hereto as 25 Exhibit 2, are hereby established for the 2020-2021 Fiscal Year: 26 27 2020-2021 Categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs 28 Acute. The percentage of available funding allocated to 1. this category shall be 35%. 29 30 2. **Prevention.** The percentage of available funding allocated

1 to this category shall be 40%.

3. Self-Sufficiency. The percentage of available funding
 allocated to this category shall be 25%.

4 Detailed definitions of each of the categories of Most
5 Vulnerable Persons and Needs are set forth in Exhibit 3.

Public Service Grants to Serve Categories of 6 Section 2. 7 Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs. Public Service Grants made by City Council shall be used to exclusively serve the categories of 8 9 Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs. Where a category contains more 10 funding than applied for, then the excess funding for that population may be applied to a category that contains less funding 11 than applied for. Where more than one category has fewer funds than 12 applied for, then the excess funding shall be divided among the 13 14 underfunded categories on a percentage basis where the total amount underfunded in all underfunded categories is the denominator and 15 the amount underfunded in any one category is the numerator. 16

Section 3. 17 Requesting emergency cycle one passage pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. Emergency one cycle 18 19 passage of this legislation is requested. The nature of the 20 emergency is that Section 118.804(b) of the Ordinance Code requires 21 that Council act on the categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and 22 Needs recommended by the PSC Council on or before May 1 of each year; in order to comply with this requirement, the Council will 23 24 need to expedite this legislation.

25 Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become 26 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 27 without the Mayor's signature.
