## ORDINANCE 2020-247

ORDINANCE MAKING CERTAIN ΑN FINDINGS AND APPROPRIATING \$9,000,000 FROM GENERAL FUND/GSD FUND BALANCE TO ESTABLISH A COVID-19 SMALL BUSINESS RELIEF GRANT PROGRAM ("PROGRAM") FOR ELIGIBLE SMALL BUSINESSES LOCATED COUNTY; AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH Α FINANCIAL INSTITUTE; PROVIDING FOR ANNUAL REPORTS TO CITY COUNCIL; REQUESTING THAT THE FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT AND OFFICE OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OVERSEE THE GRANT PROGRAM; PROCESS AND REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Section 1. Findings. It is hereby ascertained, determined, found and declared as follows:

- The recitals set forth herein are true and correct.
- By incentivizing the retention of employees and providing grant funds to small businesses within the City, the Program is designed to benefit both individuals and small businesses and will promote and further the public and municipal purposes of the City and serve to limit the severe economic impacts of COVID-19.
- The Program is designed to provide rapid economic relief to small businesses in order to maintain the viability of such businesses and the employment of individuals thereof, thus

maintaining the City's tax base and revenues.

- (d) Enhancement of the City's tax base and revenues, are matters of State and City policy and State and City concern in order that the State and its counties and municipalities, including the City, shall not continue to be endangered by unemployment, underemployment, economic recession, poverty, crime and disease, and consume an excessive proportion of the State and City revenues because of the extra services required for police, fire, accident, health care, elderly care, charity care, hospitalization, public housing and housing assistance, and other forms of public protection, services and facilities.
- (e) The Program will provide economic relief to small businesses in Duval County, thus encouraging ongoing compliance with the Emergency Measures and benefitting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Duval County.
- (f) The provision of the City's assistance is necessary and appropriate to make the Program feasible; and the City's assistance is reasonable and not excessive, taking into account the extent of the public benefits expected to be derived from the Program, and taking into account all other forms of assistance available.
- (g) The authorizations provided by this Ordinance are for public uses and purposes for which the City may use its powers as a county, municipality and as a political subdivision of the State of Florida and may expend public funds, and the necessity in the public interest for the provisions herein enacted is hereby declared as a matter of legislative determination.
- (h) This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 163, 166 and 125, Florida Statutes, as amended, the City's Charter, and other applicable provisions of law.
- Section 2. Appropriation. For the 2019-2020 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the

indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

- (c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above is from the General Fund/GSD Fund Balance. The funds will be used to provide economic incentive grants to small businesses located within Duval County.

Section 3. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 2 is to provide grants via pay cards to eligible small businesses located in Duval County to partially combat the economic impacts of the COVID-19 virus and encourage approved businesses to retain their employees for the duration of the declared emergencies.

Section 4. Carryover. The funds appropriated herein shall not lapse but shall carryover as appropriated from year to year until such funds are expended or lapse according to the terms of the Agreement and City Grant Agreements.

approved. For a period of six months from the effective date of this Ordinance, the City is authorized to award COVID-19 Small Business Relief Grants to eligible small businesses in Duval County in the amount of \$2,000 to approved applicants in accordance with the criteria attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein reference. The criteria include the requirements that the small business: (i) is located in Duval County; (ii) had no more than 100

employees on February 29th 2020; iii) has been in business for at least one (1) year from February 29, 2020; iv) must document number of employees as of February 29, 2020; (iv) shall demonstrate that since February 29, 2020 the small business has experienced a reduction in revenue of 25% or more as a direct result of the COVID-19 crisis; and (v) an officer of the small business must sign an affidavit certifying the foregoing eligibility criteria.

Section 6. Authorizing the City to enter into an agreement with a financial institution. The City is hereby authorized to enter into the Agreement with a financial institution for the purposes described in Section 3.

Section 7. Oversight Department. The Finance and Administration Department and Office of Economic Development shall provide oversight for the Program herein.

Section 8. Annual Report. The Finance and Administration Department is required to make a report annually to the City Council concerning the use of the funds authorized hereby for the Program, including the number of recipients and dollar amounts of the Grants.

Section 9. Requesting One Cycle Emergency Passage pursuant to Council Rule 4.901. One cycle emergency passage of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that the negative health and economic impacts of COVID-19 are ongoing and immediate economic assistance will assist in maintaining the viability of such businesses and associated employment.

Section 10. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
