Gaffney, Carlucci, Pittman, Newby, White and Boylan: 4 5 **RESOLUTION 2020-254** 6 7 A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING ECONOMIC RECOVERY FOR 8 RESTAURANTS, BARS AND RETAIL ESTABLISHMENTS; 9 REQUESTING SUSPENSION OF ENFORCEMENT OF THE ZONING CODE FOR CERTAIN OUTSIDE USES AND SALES 10 OF ALCOHOL FOR OFF PREMISES CONSUMPTION; 11 12 REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE; 13 PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 14 WHEREAS, on March 1, 2020, Governor DeSantis issued Executive 15 Order 20-51 directing the Florida Department of Health to issue a 16 Public Health Emergency as a result of COVID-19; and 17 WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, Governor DeSantis issued Executive 18 Order 20-52 declaring a state of emergency for the entire State of 19 20 Florida as a result of COVID-19; and 21 WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, Mayor Lenny Curry declared a state 22 of emergency for the City of Jacksonville as a result of COVID-19; 23 and 24 WHEREAS, since March 13, 2020, various local and state orders 25 have closed, restricted occupancy, or otherwise suspended onpremises activities of restaurants, bars and retail establishments 26 27 to protect the people of the State of Florida and the City of Jacksonville from the dangers of COVID-19; and 28 29 WHEREAS, on March 20, 2020, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-71 allowing vendors licensed to sell alcoholic beverages 30 for consumption on premises to sell alcoholic beverages in sealed 31

1 containers for consumption off premises, and suspending Florida 2 Statutes prohibiting a specially licensed food service 3 establishment from selling package sales of alcohol for delivery, 4 take-out or consumption off premises, through the expiration of the 5 state of emergency declared in Executive Order 20-52, including any 6 extensions, subject to certain conditions contained therein; and

7 WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville is committed to supporting 8 restaurants, bars and retailers, and their employees, as they 9 pursue creative business practices that safely serve consumers 10 during this temporary period of social distancing; and

WHEREAS, suspending enforcement of Chapter 656 of the City of Jacksonville Ordinance Code (Zoning Code) for certain uses related to restaurants, bars and retail establishments will help local businesses recover from the economic losses suffered during this emergency, while providing more flexibility for social distancing; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

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18 Section 1. Suspending Enforcement. The City Council 19 hereby requests suspension of enforcement of the Zoning Code during 20 the local or state emergencies, whichever is longer, for the 21 following uses, subject to the limitations stated herein and 22 limitations in any local or state order:

(a) Outside retail display and sales of all merchandise,subject to the following limitations:

(1) The outside area shall be contiguous to the retaillocation.

27 (2) The outside area shall not adversely impact the use28 of a sidewalk or right of way.

(3) No amplified music or other sounds are permitted.
(b) Outside sale and service of food and outside seating for
licensed restaurants, subject to the following limitations:

- 2 -

1 (1) The outside area shall be contiguous to the licensed 2 restaurant.

3 (2) The outside area shall not adversely impact the use4 of a sidewalk or right of way.

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(3) No amplified music or other sounds are permitted.

6 (c) Outside sale and service of alcohol (beer, wine or7 liquor), subject to the following limitations:

8 (1) The outside area shall be contiguous to an existing9 licensed facility or establishment.

10 (2) The outside area shall not adversely impact the use11 of a sidewalk or right of way.

12 (3) The outside area shall be no greater than the inside13 area licensed for sale and service of alcohol.

14 (4) The outside area shall be surrounded by a temporary 15 barrier at least three and a half feet high; provided, that the 16 temporary barrier may be broken by up to two entranceways no more 17 than four feet wide each.

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(5) No amplified music or other sounds are permitted.

(d) Sale of all alcohol (beer, wine or liquor) by a licensed facility or establishment for off premises consumption (also known as "package sales").

22 Section 2. Enforcement to Protect the Public's Health, 23 Safety and Welfare. The City Council hereby requests continued 24 enforcement of the Zoning Code during the local or state 25 emergencies, whichever is longer, for the above uses if the suspension requested in Section 1 would harm the public's health, 26 27 safety or welfare.

28 Section 3. No Private Property Rights Established. No 29 private property rights are established for the above uses due to 30 any suspension of enforcement of the Zoning Code during the local 31 or state emergencies. All property owners, tenants and operators

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1 shall continue to comply with any other applicable laws, rules or 2 regulations not addressed in this Resolution.

3 Section 4. Requesting One Cycle Emergency Passage Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency 4 passage of this legislation is requested. The nature of the 5 emergency is that the durations of the local and state emergencies 6 7 related to COVID-19 are unknown and as such, limitations on 8 occupancy and other operations in restaurants, bars and retail 9 establishments may continue for some time.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature of the Council President and the Council Secretary.
