## RESOLUTION 2020-233-A

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMEMORATING THE LIFE AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF SHARON SIEGEL COHEN; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Sharon Siegel Cohen, a native of Jacksonville, graduated from Wolfson High School and earned her bachelor's degree from the University of Florida, where she was President of Delta Phi Epsilon Sorority; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Siegel Cohen had a long and distinguished career in the television industry, first at WSB in Atlanta, then at WTVT in Tampa before returning to Jacksonville where for 33 years she was Executive Producer at WJXT TV-4; and

WHEREAS, in her stellar career, Sharon Siegel Cohen's work was rewarded with an Edward R. Murrow Award, several Emmy Associated Press awards, and a Peabody Award for "Behind Closed Doors," a public service effort on the complex problems of domestic violence. She was also the creator and first producer of WJXT's "The Morning Show"; and

WHEREAS, diagnosed only two years ago with ALS (commonly known as Lou Gehrig's disease), she quickly became a tireless advocate for a cure for the disease and an inspiring participant in ALS walks with her "Sharon's Songbirds" team of supporters, for which she was honored with a Courage Award in May 2019 at a benefit for Augie's Quest, a nonprofit dedicated to helping find a treatment

and cure for ALS; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Siegel Cohen was unfailingly caring and compassionate to all she met, both professionally and personally, and was particularly known for her sense of humor and her love of serenading friends and co-workers with songs for special occasions, many of her own composition. She was positive and thankful to the very end of her life, despite the challenges she faced after her diagnosis; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City of Jacksonville hereby honors and commemorates the life and accomplishments of Sharon Siegel Cohen and extends to her family, friends, and countless admirers the City's most sincere condolences. Her unfailing optimism, good humor and positivity in the face of a life-altering challenge were truly inspirational, and she will be long and gratefully remembered as a truly inspirational mentor and friend.
