A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMEMORATING THE LIFE AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF LISC EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR JANET L. OWENS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Janet Lynelle Garrett Owens, a native of South Carolina, graduated from Greenville High School, earned her bachelor's degree in political science from Russell Sage College in Troy, New York, and began a career in city government, first back at home in Greenville and then in Adrian, Michigan; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Owens' career then took her to Washington, D.C. 18 19 where she worked for the International City Management Association 20 and then for the District of Columbia government. While in Washington she met and married Gregory Owens, and the couple moved 21 briefly to St. Augustine and then to Jacksonville where she worked 22 for Volunteer Jacksonville, Girl Scouts of Gateway Council Inc., 23 24 United Way of Northeast Florida, and finally LISC Jacksonville, where she was named Executive Director in 2010; and 25

WHEREAS, throughout her professional career, Janet Owens was a tireless champion for citizen empowerment and community revitalization, deeply committed to creating real, sustainable communities and helping the most vulnerable in society achieve respect and security through the creation of affordable housing, 1 economic opportunity and investment, and the promotion of safe, 2 livable neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, in addition to her professional positions, Ms. Owens 3 was a true community steward, serving on numerous boards and 4 5 commissions, including the Rotary Club of Jacksonville, Jacksonville Regional Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors and 6 7 Board of Governors, JP Morgan Chase Florida Community Advisory Board, Leadership Jacksonville, and the City's Better Jacksonville 8 9 Plan Finance and Administration Committee. She received the Girl 10 Scouts of Gateway Council Women of Distinction Award, the University of North Florida's OneJax Humanitarian Award, and was 11 recognized by Leadership Jacksonville as an Outstanding Community 12 Trustee, among other honors; and 13

WHEREAS, throughout her professional and personal lives, Janet Owens was most well known for her boundless optimism, her compassion, and her absolute dedication to improving the lives of everyone in our community, and was ever enthusiastic and unfailingly positive even as she faced personal challenges; now therefore
