RESOLUTION 2020-254-A

A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING ECONOMIC RECOVERY FOR RESTAURANTS, BARS AND RETAIL ESTABLISHMENTS; REQUESTING SUSPENSION OF ENFORCEMENT OF THE ZONING CODE FOR CERTAIN OUTSIDE USES AND SALES OF ALCOHOL FOR OFF PREMISES CONSUMPTION; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on March 1, 2020, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-51 directing the Florida Department of Health to issue a Public Health Emergency as a result of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-52 declaring a state of emergency for the entire State of Florida as a result of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, Mayor Lenny Curry declared a state of emergency for the City of Jacksonville as a result of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, since March 13, 2020, various local and state orders have closed, restricted occupancy, or otherwise suspended on-premises activities of restaurants, bars and retail establishments to protect the people of the State of Florida and the City of Jacksonville from the dangers of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 20, 2020, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-71 allowing vendors licensed to sell alcoholic beverages for consumption on premises to sell alcoholic beverages in sealed containers for consumption off premises, and suspending Florida Statutes prohibiting a specially licensed food service establishment from selling package sales of alcohol for delivery, take-out or consumption off premises, through the expiration of the state of emergency declared in Executive Order 20-52, including any extensions, subject to certain conditions contained therein; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville is committed to supporting restaurants, bars and retailers, and their employees, as they pursue creative business practices that safely serve consumers during this temporary period of social distancing; and

WHEREAS, suspending enforcement of Chapter 656 of the City of Jacksonville Ordinance Code (Zoning Code) for certain uses related to restaurants, bars and retail establishments will help local businesses recover from the economic losses suffered during this emergency, while providing more flexibility for social distancing; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

- Section 1. Suspending Enforcement. The City Council hereby requests suspension of enforcement of the Zoning Code during the local or state emergencies, whichever is longer, for the following uses, subject to the limitations stated herein and limitations in any local or state order:
- (a) Outside retail display and sales of all merchandise, subject to the following limitations:
- (1) The outside area shall be contiguous to the retail location.
- (2) The outside area shall not adversely impact the use of a sidewalk or right of way.

- No amplified music or other sounds are permitted.
- Outside sale and service of food and outside seating for licensed restaurants, subject to the following limitations:
- The outside area shall be contiguous to the licensed restaurant.
- (2) The outside area shall not adversely impact the use of a sidewalk or right of way.
 - No amplified music or other sounds are permitted.
- Outside sale and service of alcohol (beer, wine or liquor), subject to the following limitations:
- The outside area shall be contiguous to an existing (1)licensed facility or establishment.
- The outside area shall not adversely impact the use (2) of a sidewalk or right of way.
- The outside area shall be no greater than the inside (3) area licensed for sale and service of alcohol.
- The outside area shall be surrounded by a temporary barrier at least three and a half feet high; provided, that the temporary barrier may be broken by up to two entranceways no more than four feet wide each.
 - (5) No amplified music or other sounds are permitted.
- Sale of all alcohol (beer, wine or liquor) by a licensed facility or establishment for off premises consumption (also known as "package sales").
- Section 2. Enforcement to Protect the Public's Health, Safety and Welfare. The City Council hereby requests continued enforcement of the Zoning Code during the local or state emergencies, whichever is longer, for the above uses if the suspension requested in Section 1 would harm the public's health, safety or welfare.
 - Section 3. No Private Property Rights Established. No

private property rights are established for the above uses due to any suspension of enforcement of the Zoning Code during the local or state emergencies. All property owners, tenants and operators shall continue to comply with any other applicable laws, rules or regulations not addressed in this Resolution.

Section 4. Requesting Emergency Passage Upon Introduction Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. Emergency passage upon introduction of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that the durations of the local and state emergencies related to COVID-19 are unknown and as such, limitations on occupancy and other operations in restaurants, bars and retail establishments may continue for some time.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature of the Council President and the Council Secretary.
