AN ORDINANCE REGARDING PUBLIC SERVICE GRANTS;
PROVIDING A NINETY-DAY EXTENSION FOR MEETING
REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 118.201(F)(4) OR (5)
FOR THOSE PUBLIC SERVICE GRANT RECIPIENTS WHO
WERE REQUIRED TO SUBMIT AUDIT REPORTS BY THE
END OF APRIL OR MAY 2020; REQUESTING EMERGENCY
PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN
EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, recipients of public service grants under Chapter 118, Ordinance Code, are required to comply with certain audit and reporting requirements; and

WHEREAS, Section 118.201(f)(4) & (5) require that recipients receiving City funding of \$100,000 or more furnish the City with a copy of an audit report meeting professional industry standards within 120 days of the close of the recipient's fiscal year based upon the City's fiscal year of October 1 through September 30; and

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has drastically changed the manner in which businesses can operate and since mid-March, 2020, the City has requested that businesses operate to the extent possible with employees working from home and not opening business buildings to employees, contract consultants or visitors; and

WHEREAS, as a consequence of the business approach to minimize the least amount of contact between individuals, these public service grant recipients have been unable to have their auditors provide these auditing services; and

WHEREAS, without legislative action to extend the deadline, these public service grant recipients whose audit reports are due would be placed on the City's non-compliant list and their City funding would be withheld; and

WHEREAS, now more than ever, public service grant recipients need to be able to access public service grant funding to provide services to those individuals and groups affected by the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the Council desires to extend the deadline for those whose audit reports are due for a period of 90 days to allow the grant recipients to be able to complete their audit requirements while also allowing them to continue to serve the citizens of Jacksonville during this difficult time; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Extending the Deadline for Compliance with Section 118.201(f)(4) & (5). The City of Jacksonville hereby acknowledges the contract requirement and extends the period of time outlined in Section 118.201(f)(4) & (5), Ordinance Code, to extend the deadline for those public service grant recipients who have audit reports due in April or May 2020 for an additional ninety (90) days. The City of Jacksonville hereby acknowledges and revises the contract requirement that the audit report be received within 120 days of the close of recipient's fiscal year to provide for a ninety (90) day extension, and directs the Grants Compliance Officer to continue to monitor and administer the remaining grant funds in accordance with the contracts.

Section 2. Requesting Emergency Passage Upon Introduction, Pursuant to Council Rules 4.901 Emergency. Emergency passage upon introduction is requested. The nature of the emergency is that there are at least three public service grant recipients who cannot receive any additional City funds until the deadline is

extended because they were unable to complete the audit reports due to COVID-19. These recipients provide social services to individuals and groups impacted by COVID-19 and need to be able to continue to provide those services immediately during this pandemic crisis.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
