Introduced by Council Member Diamond and Co-Sponsored by Council 1 2 Member Morgan: 3 4 RESOLUTION 2020-271 5 A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING THE MONTH OF MAY AS 6 7 MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS AND TRAUMA INFORMED 8 CARE MONTH IN JACKSONVILLE; REQUESTING 9 EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 10 11 WHEREAS, mental health is essential to everyone's overall 12 13 health and well-being; and 14 WHEREAS, everyone experiences times of stress and struggles in 15 their lives; and WHEREAS, one in four adults and one in five youth ages 13-18 16 experience serious mental illness; and 17 WHEREAS, 60 percent of adults and 50 percent of youth do not 18 receive the treatment necessary for their mental health needs due 19 20 to limited or no knowledge of the need, barriers to care, or fear 21 and shame; and 22 WHEREAS, research recognizes that adverse childhood 23 experiences (ACEs), which include, but are not limited to physical, 24 sexual abuse, physical and emotional neglect, emotional and 25 household dysfunction, untreated mental illness, or incarceration 26 of a household member, domestic violence, and separation or divorce 27 involving household members, are traumatic experiences that can 2.8 have a profound effect on a child's developing brain and body and 29 can result in poor physical and mental health during childhood and adulthood; and 30

WHEREAS, community understanding and available supports and

1 services can greatly impact a person's ability to handle their 2 stress and struggle and move forward; and

WHEREAS, promoting mental health and wellness leads to higher overall productivity, better educational outcomes, lower crime rates, stronger economies, lower health care costs, improved family life, improved quality of life and increased lifespan; and

7 WHEREAS, studies show that the effects of ACEs are felt by 8 people regardless of race, ethnicity, religion, gender, sexual 9 orientation, or socio-economic status; and

WHEREAS, each business, school, government agency, healthcare provider, faith-based organization, non-profit agency and citizen shares accountability for the community's mental health needs and has a responsibility to promote mental wellness and support prevention efforts; and

WHEREAS, the Jacksonville City Council recognizes the impact of awareness and education, access to services and acceptance of the importance of mental health and well-being to a person's overall success and supports the implementation of trauma informed approaches throughout the systems of care; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

21 Section 1. The City of Jacksonville hereby declares the month of May as Mental Health Awareness and Trauma Informed Care 22 month in Jacksonville and urges all citizens to join the national 23 24 movement to raise awareness about mental health. Citizens are 25 urged to join the fight against stigma associated with mental 26 health illness and to take advantage of resources and opportunities 27 available to them to become more aware of the importance of mental 28 health and well-being to a person's overall success. To that end, 29 the City supports the implementation of trauma informed approaches 30 throughout the systems of care, including support and education for the public, along with advocating for policies that support people 31

1 with mental illness and their families.

2 Section 2. Requesting emergency passage upon introduction 3 pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. Emergency passage upon introduction of this legislation is requested. The nature of the 4 emergency is that May is designated nationally as Mental Health 5 month and the City Council desires to show its support for the 6 7 national dialogue on mental health awareness and wishes to make strides locally for acceptance and support for individuals within 8 9 the local community.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
