9 AN ORDINANCE MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS AND APPROPRIATING \$9,000,000 FROM GENERAL FUND/GSD 10 11 FUND BALANCE TO ESTABLISH A COVID-19 SMALL 12 BUSINESS RELIEF GRANT PROGRAM ("PROGRAM") FOR 13 ELIGIBLE SMALL BUSINESSES LOCATED IN DUVAL 14 COUNTY; PROVIDING THAT INDIVIDUALS WHO RECEIVE 15 A 1099 TAX FORM OR ARE A SOLE PROPRIETOR ARE 16 ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE GRANT FUNDING, WHICH CAN 17 BE USED FOR ANY BUSINESS LOSSES; AUTHORIZING 18 THE CITY TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH 19 FIDELITY NATIONAL INFORMATION SERVICES; 20 INVOKING THE EXCEPTION OF 126.107(G) 21 (EXEMPTIONS), CHAPTER 126 (PROCUREMENT CODE), 22 ORDINANCE CODE, ТΟ DIRECT CONTRACT WITH 23 FIDELITY NATIONAL INFORMATION SERVICES, INC. ("FIS") TO PROVIDE PAYMENT CARDS TO THE CITY 24 25 TO BE PROVIDED TO APPROVED GRANT RECIPIENTS UNDER THE COVID-19 SMALL BUSINESS RELIEF GRANT 26 27 PROGRAM; PROVIDING FOR MONTHLY REPORTS TO CITY 28 COUNCIL; REQUESTING THAT THE FINANCE AND 29 ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT AND OFFICE OF 30 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OVERSEE THE GRANT PROCESS

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AND PROGRAM; REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Findings. It is hereby ascertained, determined, found and declared as follows:

(a) The recitals set forth herein are true and correct.

7 (b) By incentivizing the retention of employees and providing 8 grant funds to small businesses within the City, the Program is 9 designed to benefit both individuals and small businesses and will 10 promote and further the public and municipal purposes of the City 11 and serve to limit the severe economic impacts of COVID-19.

12 (c) The Program is designed to provide rapid economic relief 13 to small businesses in order to maintain the viability of such 14 businesses and the employment of individuals thereof, thus 15 maintaining the City's tax base and revenues.

16 (d) Enhancement of the City's tax base and revenues, are 17 matters of State and City policy and State and City concern in order 18 that the State and its counties and municipalities, including the 19 City, shall not continue to be endangered by unemployment, underemployment, economic recession, poverty, crime and disease, and 20 consume an excessive proportion of the State and City revenues 21 because of the extra services required for police, fire, accident, 22 23 health care, elderly care, charity care, hospitalization, public 24 housing and housing assistance, and other forms of public 25 protection, services and facilities.

(e) The Program will provide economic relief to small businesses in Duval County, thus encouraging ongoing compliance with the Emergency Measures and benefitting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Duval County.

30 (f) The provision of the City's assistance is necessary and 31 appropriate to make the Program feasible; and the City's assistance

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is reasonable and not excessive, taking into account the extent of
 the public benefits expected to be derived from the Program, and
 taking into account all other forms of assistance available.

(g) The authorizations provided by this Ordinance are for
public uses and purposes for which the City may use its powers as a
county, municipality and as a political subdivision of the State of
Florida and may expend public funds, and the necessity in the public
interest for the provisions herein enacted is hereby declared as a
matter of legislative determination.

(h) This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the provisions of
Chapters 163, 166 and 125, Florida Statutes, as amended, the City's
Charter, and other applicable provisions of law.

Section 2. Appropriation. For the 2019-2020 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

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(c) **Explanation of Appropriation:**

The funding above is from the General Fund/GSD Fund Balance. The funds will be used to provide economic incentive grants to small businesses located within Duval County.

28 Section 3. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in 29 Section 2 is to provide grants via pay cards to eligible small 30 businesses located in Duval County to partially combat the economic 31 impacts of the COVID-19 virus and encourage approved businesses to

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1 retain their employees for the duration of the declared 2 emergencies.

3 COVID-19 Small Business Relief Grant Program Section 4. approved. For a period of six months from the effective date of 4 this Ordinance, the City is authorized to award COVID-19 Small 5 Business Relief Grants to eligible small businesses in Duval County 6 7 in the amount of \$2,000 to approved applicants in accordance with the criteria attached hereto as Fourth Revised Exhibit 2, labeled 8 9 as "Fourth Revised Exhibit 2, 4th Revised Criteria, May 26, 2020 -10 Floor" and incorporated herein reference. The criteria include the requirements that the small business: (i) is located in Duval 11 County; (ii) had no more than 100 employees on February 29th 2020; 12 iii) has been in business for at least on (1) year from February 13 29, 2020; iv) must document number of employees as of February 29, 14 2020; (iv) shall demonstrate that since February 29, 2020 the small 15 business has experienced a reduction in revenue of 25% or more as a 16 direct result of the COVID-19 crisis; and (v) an officer of the 17 small business must sign an affidavit certifying the foregoing 18 19 eligibility criteria.

20 Section 5. Additional eligibility criteria. An individual 21 who receives a 1099 tax form or is a sole proprietor is eligible to 22 receive grant funding, which can be used for any business losses.

23 Authorizing the Section 6. City to enter into an agreement with Fidelity National Information Services (FIS). The 24 25 City is hereby authorized to enter into an Agreement with Fidelity 26 National Information Services for the purposes described in Section 27 3, and to also allow for a negotiated compensation to FIS.

28 Section 7. Invoking the exception to Section 126.107(g), 29 Ordinance Code. The City is hereby authorized to enter into the 30 Agreement with Fidelity National Information Services, Inc. for the 31 purposes described in Section 3, as well as allowing for a

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negotiated compensation to FIS. Pursuant to Section 126.107(g) 1 2 (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such procurement is exempted 3 from competitive solicitation because the supplies or services are 4 to be provided by those specifically prescribed within authorizing 5 legislation that appropriates the same. With the exception of the 6 7 foregoing, all other provisions of Chapter 126, Ordinance Code, shall remain in full force and effect. 8

9 Section 8. Authorizing the City to enter into an 10 agreement with a financial institution. The City is hereby 11 authorized to enter into the Agreement with a financial institution 12 for the purposes described in Section 3.

13 Section 9. Oversight Department. The Finance and
14 Administration Department and Office of Economic Development shall
15 provide oversight for the Program herein.

16 Section 10. Monthly Report. The Finance and 17 Administration Department is required to make a report monthly to 18 the City Council concerning the use of the funds authorized hereby 19 for the Program, including the number of recipients and dollar 20 amounts of the Grants.

21 Section 11. Requesting One Cycle Emergency Passage 22 pursuant to Council Rule 4.901. One cycle emergency passage of this 23 legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that the negative health and economic impacts of COVID-19 are ongoing and 24 25 immediate economic assistance will assist in maintaining the viability of such businesses and associated employment. 26

27 Section 12. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become 28 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 29 without the Mayor's signature.
