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RESOLUTION 2020-325

A RESOLUTION REGARDING THE PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY CONCERNS FOR THE RESIDENTS OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE; URGING SHERIFF MIKE WILLIAMS TO WORK COOPERATIVELY WITH THE ATTORNEY'S OFFICE WITH PUBLIC INPUT IN ORDER REFINE AND IMPROVE THE CURRENT REGARDING THE RELEASE OF BODY CAMERA FOOTAGE RELATED TO CLAIMS OF POLICE VIOLENCE MISCONDUCT, AS PERMITTED BY LAW; REQUESTING THAT SHERIFF MIKE WILLIAMS AND THE STATE ATTORNEY'S OFFICE PROVIDE THE PUBILC ACCESS TO BODY CAMERA FOOTAGE, WHERE PERMITTED BY LAW AND WHERE THE INFORMATION IS AVAILABLE AS A PUBLIC RECORD; DIRECTING UPON ADOPTION THE LEGISLATIVE SERVICES DIVISION TO FORWARD COPIES OF THIS RESOLUTION TO THE SHERIFF AND THE STATE ATTORNEY, MELISSA NELSON; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Jacksonville Sheriff's Office WHEREAS, the (JSO) began implementing a body camera program in the fall of 2018; and

WHEREAS, the release of body camera footage where police violence or misconduct is alleged can be beneficial to the public to help build transparency and trust in the community; and

WHEREAS, recent events of alleged police misconduct have renewed calls from the public for release of body camera video of police shootings in Jacksonville and in other communities throughout the nation; and

WHEREAS, while the Council appreciates that body camera footage should not and cannot be released by JSO or the State Attorney's Office while a criminal investigation is underway, the Council believes that body camera footage should be released timely as a public record after all investigations and internal review by JSO has been completed and the investigations closed; and

WHEREAS, there remains some uncertainty of the public at large as to the current JSO policy regarding the release of body camera footage and the Council believes that the public would benefit from the transparency of understanding the JSO policy on release of body camera footage; and

WHEREAS, Sheriff Mike Williams, at a news conference held on Tuesday, June 2, 2020 indicated that he was open to changing the body camera video release policy, if it's legally allowable, and that he would communicate further with State Attorney Melissa Nelson's Office regarding formulation of the policy; and

WHEREAS, the Council encourages Sheriff Williams and State Attorney Nelson to continue their ongoing discussions to promote transparency in the release of body camera footage, where allowed by law; and

WHEREAS, the Council recognizes that the release of body camera footage involves a balance between protecting the integrity of the investigation and determining at what point the video is a public record to which the public can view it; and

WHEREAS, for the above reasons, the City of Jacksonville supports the Sheriff and the State Attorney in working to improve upon the current policy regarding the release of body camera footage to allow for the utmost transparency in the process, as permitted by law, and following the closure of all relevant investigative measures by JSO and the State Attorney's Office; and

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WHEREAS, the City Council desires to express these sentiments to Sheriff Williams, State Attorney Nelson and to the citizens of Jacksonville; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Encouraging cooperation by the Sheriff and the State Attorney's Office, with public input where possible, to refine and improve the current policy. The Council of the City of Jacksonville hereby encourages Sheriff Williams and State Attorney Nelson to refine and improve the current policy regarding the release of body camera footage, to the extent permissible by law, to allow for the utmost transparency to the public when all investigations have been concluded and the video is deemed a public record. The Council also urges the Sheriff and State Attorney Nelson, to the extent possible, to take input from the pubic prior to modifying the policy so that interested citizens may provide input in the process and as to the policy.

Section 2. Urging the Sheriff and State Attorney to footage policy access to body camera and information to the public. The Council also urges the Sheriff and State Attorney Nelson that once the policy has been refined, that JSO and State Attorney's Office inform the public of the final iteration of the policy and provide a copy of the policy on their respective websites, and direct the public to additional information so that the public has access to the policy and may make requests for information consistent with the policy.

Section 3. Direction to Circulate upon Adoption. The Council hereby directs, upon adoption, the Legislative Services Division to forward copies of this resolution to Sheriff Mike Williams and State Attorney Melissa Nelson.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective

without the Mayor's signature.
