AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING A CONTINUATION GRANT; APPROPRIATING \$2,610,888.00 IN ANNUAL HOUSING OPPORTUNITIES FOR PERSONS WITH AIDS PROGRAM GRANT FUNDING FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT TO PROVIDE A WIDE RANGE OF HOUSING, SOCIAL SERVICES, PROGRAM PLANNING, AND DEVELOPMENT COSTS LOW-INCOME PERSONS LIVING WITH HIV/AIDS AND THEIR FAMILIES WITHIN DUVAL COUNTY, INITIATED BY REVISED B.T. 21-004; APPROVING POSITION, AS INITIATED ΒY R.C. PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2020-2021 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum from the account listed in subsection (a) to the account listed in subsection (b):

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(c) Explanation of Appropriation.

The funding above in the amount of \$2,610,888.00 consists of an annual Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) grant from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for the HOPWA program. The HOPWA program is administered by the Housing and Community Development Division and was established to provide housing assistance and related supportive services for low-income persons living with HIV/AIDS and their families.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide a wide range of housing, social services, program planning, and development costs, including but not limited to: the acquisition, rehabilitation, or new construction of housing units; costs for facility operations; rental assistance; and, short term payments to prevent homelessness. An essential component in providing housing assistance for this targeted special needs population is the coordination and delivery of support services. Consequently, HOPWA funds also may be used for services, including but not limited to: assessment and case management; substance abuse treatment; mental health treatment; nutritional services; training and placement assistance; and, assistance with daily living. The Schedule of Proposed Funding detailing the proposed use of funds is attached hereto as Exhibit 3. A copy of the grant award letter is attached hereto as Exhibit 4.

Section 3. Additional authority. In the event a subrecipient is unable or unwilling to accept an award of funds, the funds may be reallocated to the next eligible awardee using the same method and criteria normally applied by the Commission.

Section 4. Approval of Position. There is hereby

approved the position more fully described in R.C. 21-003, attached 1 2 hereto as **Exhibit 2** and incorporated herein by this reference. Effective Date. Section 5. This ordinance shall become 3 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 4 without the Mayor's signature. 5
