Explanation of Appropriation 6 (C) 7 The funding above in the amount of \$552,683.00 comprises 8 annual Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funding from the 9 U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to 10 be administered pursuant to 24 CFR 576.100(c). The City must obligate all funds, except for the amount designated 11 for administrative costs, within 180 days after HUD signs 12 the grant agreement, and all funds must be expended 13 within 24 months after HUD signs the grant agreement. 14

Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in 15 Section 2. Section 1 is to provide funding to: i) engage homeless individuals 16 17 and families living on the street; ii) improve the number and quality of emergency shelters for homeless individuals 18 and 19 families; iii) help operate these shelters; iv) provide essential 20 services to shelter residents; v) rapidly re-house homeless 21 individuals and families; and, vi) prevent individuals and families 22 from becoming homeless. The Schedule of Proposed Funding detailing 23 the proposed use of funds is attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** and 24 incorporated herein by this reference. A copy of the grant award 25 letter is attached hereto as Exhibit 3.

26 Section 3. Additional authority. In the event a sub-27 recipient is unable or unwilling to accept an award of funds, the 28 funds shall be reallocated to the next eligible awardee using the 29 same method and criteria applied by the Commission.

30 Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become 31 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
