APPROPRIATING ΑN ORDINANCE \$785**,**000 FROM FOR THE PERFORMING RESERVES ACCOUNT CENTER-DOWNTOWN VISITOR CENTER CIP PROJECT TO DUVAL COUNTY TOURIST DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL ("TDC") OPERATIONS ACCOUNT; PURPOSE; AMENDING THE TDC FISCAL YEAR 2019-2020 BUDGET (REVISED SCHEDULE W) APPROVED BY ORDINANCE 2019-504-E (CITY'S ANNUAL BUDGET), TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR TDC OPERATIONS TO OFFSET THE ANTICIPATED LOSSES IN TOURIST DEVELOPMENT TAXES DUE COVID-19; AMENDING THE 2020-2024 FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM APPROVED ORDINANCE 2019-505-E TO REDUCE FUNDING FOR THE "PERFORMING ARTS CENTER-DOWNTOWN VISITOR CENTER" CIP PROJECT; PROVIDING FOR WAIVER OF CHAPTER 666 (DUVAL COUNTY TOURIST DEVELOPMENT PLAN), SECTION 666.108(D)(1) (DEVELOPMENT ACCOUNT), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW FOR ANY UNALLOCATED FUNDS REMAINING FROM THE \$785,000 APPROPRIATED HEREIN TO TRANSFER AT THE END OF THE 2019-2020 FISCAL YEAR TΟ THE TDC CONTINGENCY ACCOUNT; PROVIDING Α TDC RECOMMENDATION REGARDING THE DOWNTOWN VISITOR CENTER LOCATION PURSUANT TO ORDINANCE 2019-854-E; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE TDC; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Duval County Tourist Development Council (the "Tourist Development Council" or "TDC"), pursuant to Chapter 70, Ordinance Code, administers the Tourist Development Plan set forth in Chapter 666, Ordinance Code; and

WHEREAS, the TDC chairman at its January 23, 2020, regular meeting appointed a Tourist Bureau Committee to make recommendations regarding the downtown visitor center as required in Ordinance 2019-854-E;

WHEREAS, the TDC called an emergency meeting on April 17, 2020, to discuss among other things the Tourist Bureau Committee's downtown visitor center recommendations and the impacts of COVID-19 on existing TDC contracts and the Duval county tourism industry in general; and

WHEREAS, after extensive discussions, the TDC at its emergency meeting on April 17, 2020, unanimously voted to (1) transfer \$785,000 from the reserves account for the Times Union Performing Arts-Downtown Visitor Center project to the TDC operations account to offset anticipated losses in tourist development tax revenues; and (2) authorize Visit Jacksonville to pursue lease negotiations to relocate the existing downtown visitor center to a site other than the Times Union Performing Arts Center, including, but not limited to, the 100 N. Laura Street (Center State Bank Building) site and other potential lease site locations downtown; now therefore

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Recitals. The recitals set forth above are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2. Appropriation. For the 2019-2020 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

- (c) Explanation of Appropriation. This ordinance appropriates \$785,000.00 from "Reserves" for the Performing Arts-Downtown Visitor Center Project to Trust Fund Authorized Expenditures in the Tourist Development Council Operations Account.

Section 3. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation above is to transfer funding originally appropriated for a new downtown visitor center to be located at the Times Union Performing Arts Center to Tourist Development Council operations to help offset the anticipated losses in tourist development taxes due to COVID-19.

Section 4. Amending the TDC Fiscal Year 2019-2020 Budget (Revised Schedule W) approved by Ordinance 2019-504-E (City's Annual Budget). There is hereby amended the Fiscal Year 2019-2020 budget for the Tourist Development Council by replacing Revised Schedule W, approved by Ordinance 2019-504-E (City's annual budget), with the Second Revised Schedule W attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference, to provide funding to help offset the anticipated losses in tourist development taxes due to COVID-19.

Section 5. Amendment to Capital Improvement Program.

Ordinance 2019-505-E, being the 2020-2024 Five-Year Capital Improvement Program for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to reduce the project funding for the project entitled "Performing Arts Center - Downtown Visitor"

Center". The amended project description is more fully described in the Project Information Sheet, attached hereto as Exhibit 3. The Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the community because the TDC no longer desires to have a downtown visitor center at the Performing Arts Center and needs the CIP funding allocated to "Performing Arts Center -Downtown Visitor Center" project to assist with offsetting the anticipated losses in tourist development taxes for fiscal year 2019-2020 due to COVID-19. Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Code, enactment of this ordinance requires affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2019-505-In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Program approved by Ordinance 2019-505-E shall continue in full force and effect.

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Section 6. Waiver of the provisions in Chapter 666 (Duval County Tourist Development Plan), Section 666.108(d)(1)(Development Account), Ordinance Code. The City hereby waives the provisions in Chapter 666 (Duval County Tourist Development Plan), 666.108(d)(1)(Development Account), Ordinance Code, with respect to the transfer of unallocated funds to the Development Account. waiver is needed in order to allow any funds from the \$785,000 appropriated herein not used to offset anticipated losses in tourist development tax revenue to be transferred at the end of the Tourist Development 2019-2020 fiscal year to the Contingency Account, which the TDC believes is the more appropriate account during COVID-19 for unallocated funds be transferred. Pursuant to Section 666.108(g), Ordinance enactment of this ordinance requires the affirmative vote of a

Downtown Visitor Center Recommendation. 2 3 City hereby approves the TDC's recommendation to not move forward with constructing a new downtown visitor center at the Times Union 4 Performing Arts Center and to pursue a downtown visitor center 5 lease at another site downtown. 6 7 Section 8.
