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OF PUBLIC RIGHTS-OF-WAY OR FACILITIES TAKE PLACE WITHIN THE CORRIDOR; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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WHEREAS, the Bay Street Innovation Corridor ("Corridor") will 17 18 encompass three miles from the Jacksonville Regional Transportation 19 center to the Sports Complex and Entertainment District located 20 around TIAA Bank Field; and

21 WHEREAS, the Corridor will encompass the JTA Ultimate Urban 22 Circulator (U2C) that will have a fleet of Autonomous Vehicles capable of using both the elevated Skyway infrastructure and 23 24 initially the Bay Street Corridor at street level, and eventually 25 expanding throughout the City of Jacksonville; and

26 WHEREAS, the Corridor will also incorporate an Integrated Data 27 Exchange that will have an array of sensors that can monitor 28 weather, flooding, pedestrian movements, traffic flow, traffic 29 signals, parking availability, and many other conditions which will 30 enhance mobility and livability in the downtown area; and

WHEREAS, the Corridor will act as a testbed for new emerging technologies which should enable new ideas to be quickly approved for testing and validation of concept; and

WHEREAS, Florida Governor Ron DeSantis recently signed House
Bill 311 which allows Autonomous Vehicle operations in the State of
Florida; and

7 WHEREAS, the Jacksonville Transportation Authority has received a \$12.5 million BUILD (Better Utilizing Investments to 8 9 Leverage Development) Grant from the U.S. Department of 10 Transportation to test and introduce autonomous vehicles on the Bay Street Corridor; and 11

WHEREAS, the North Florida Smart Region Coalition was recognized as one of ten finalists in the 2019 Smart Cities Readiness Challenge, in part for having more than 100 public and private partners collaborating to advance new energy, safety, telecommunications, and health and human services initiatives; and

WHEREAS, JEA has a significant amount of dark fiber infrastructure in the Bay Street Corridor which will enable high speed data transfer and communication exchange; and

20 WHEREAS, the Bay Street Innovation Corridor will attract 21 investment to the area and grow jobs in the community; now 22 therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Designating Bay Street as the "Bay Street Innovation Corridor." The City of Jacksonville hereby designates Bay Street and its associated public rights-of-way from the Jacksonville Regional Transportation Center in LaVilla on the west to the Sports Complex and Entertainment District surrounding TIAA Bank Field on the east as the "Bay Street Innovation Corridor" as depicted on the map attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

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Section 2. Requesting City Departments and Independent

Authorities to establish policies and procedures regarding the "Bay 1 2 Street Innovation Corridor." The City Council requests that City departments (including, but not limited to, the Public Works and 3 Planning and Development Departments) and appropriate independent 4 5 authorities (including, but not limited to, and JEA the Jacksonville Transportation Authority) establish policies 6 and 7 procedures for the promotion and streamlined adoption of new transportation, mobility and communication infrastructure 8 and 9 technologies within the Bay Street Innovation Corridor. The 10 policies should include consideration of and criteria for the installation of advanced technologies when maintenance or repairs 11 of public rights-of-way and other facilities take place within the 12 Innovation Corridor. 13

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
