KIPP Jacksonville Schools operates three schools in Northwest Jacksonville providing both an extended school year and longer school day for students in north and west Jacksonville. This model allows KIPP to provide the equivalent of more than 3 weeks of instruction than is required by the Florida Department of Education. With this additional time, KIPP Jacksonville Schools help students catch up to their peers, acquire essential academic knowledge and skills, and become prepared for college and career choices. KIPP's longer day also allows time for children to experience key extracurricular programs at no cost to families.

- 1. Transfer \$466,064 of unspent funds from part-time dollars in summer jobs and pre-teens to Subsidies and Other Contributions account within Out-of-School-Time and Grief Counseling/Burials activities. (see #s 2 & 3 below for details)
  2. Transfer \$21,366 of unspent part time dollars to Grief Counseling/Burials. The current contract with Allison Brundick Haramis Foundation for child burials has run out of money and we are still receiving numerous requests. Therefore, we would like to increase this contract to continue to help families in need.
- 3. Transfer \$444,698 of unspent part time dollars to Out-of-School-Time, these funds will be used to request the legislation necessary for the City Council to authorize KHA to direct fund the Jacksonville Alliance for KIPP Schools during the 20-21 school year for \$631,018. The organization has been funded at the same level for the past three years within the Out-of-School Time (OST) Essential Service Category. With the new RFP issued in March 2020, their program model was no longer eligible because the extra services are offered as part of extended hours to the school day for all students, rather than during after-school hours to a subset of students. Nevertheless, KHA has seen promise in this model and is able to continue funding it through direct funding to ensure these children continue to receive the enhanced services provided. The remaining \$186,320 to fund this direct funding request will be taken out of unspent grant matching funds already in the Out-of-School Time essential service category.
