\$8,069,919.30 OF ADDITIONAL CARES ACT GRANT FUNDING RECEIVED FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF TREASURY TO SPECIAL REVENUE FUND - EMERGENCY INCIDENTS - MISCELLANEOUS GRANTS AND AIDS TO APPROPRIATION OF THE REDUCE THE CITY'S OPERATING RESERVES FOR THE COVID-19 SMALL BUSINESS RELIEF GRANT PROGRAM AS PREVIOUSLY AUTHORIZED BY 2020-247-E, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 20-097; PURPOSE OF APPROPRIATIONS; PROVIDING A CARRYOVER OF FUNDS FROM YEAR TO YEAR UNTIL SUCH FUNDS ARE EXPENDED OR LAPSE, PROVIDING THAT ANY CARES GRANT FUNDING NOT EXPENDED PURSUANT TO THIS ORDINANCE NOVEMBER 1, 2020 SHALL REVERT TO THE FUND OF ORIGIN FOR REAPROPRIATION FOR AUTHORIZED EXPENDITURES UNDER THE TERMS OF THE CARES GRANT; REQUESTING ONE-CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Appropriation. For the 2019-2020 fiscal year, City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above is an appropriation of an additional \$8,069,919.30 of CARES Act grant funding received by the City from the Federal government pursuant to the CARES Act. The funds will be used to reduce the appropriation of the City's operating reserves for the COVID-19 Small Business Relief Grant Program previously authorized by 2020-247-E.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide \$8,069,919.30 of CARES Act funding to the COVID-19 Small Business Relief Grant Program ("Program") previously authorized by 2020-247-E for \$9,000,000. This reduces the appropriation of the City's operating reserves to this Program by \$8,069,919.30 and replaces it with CARES Act funding. Council finds that such funding is a necessary expenditure incurred due to the COVID-19 health emergency to protect the health and welfare of the citizens of Duval County.

Section 3. Carryover. The funds appropriated herein shall not lapse but shall carryover as appropriated from year to year until such funds are expended or lapse. Funds appropriated in this Ordinance must be disbursed before November 1, 2020, failure to do so will cause funds to revert to accounts of origin subject to future Council approval.

Section 4. Requesting One-Cycle Emergency Passage pursuant to Council Rule 4.901. One-cycle emergency passage of

this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that 1 the negative health and economic impacts of COVID-19 are ongoing 2 and immediate economic assistance will assist in maintaining the 3 viability of such businesses and associated employment. 4 Effective Date.
