AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$3,000,000 OF CARES ACT GRANT FUNDING RECEIVED FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF TREASURY TO: \$2,000,000 TO THE COVID-19 SMALL BUSINESS RELIEF GRANT PROGRAM AND \$1,000,000 TO THE COVID-19 SENIOR AND DISABLED FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM; AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO ENTER INTO AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT WITH FIDELITY NATIONAL INFORMATION SERVICES; INVOKING EXCEPTION OF 126.107(G) (EXEMPTIONS), CHAPTER 126 (PROCUREMENT CODE), ORDINANCE CODE, DIRECT CONTRACT WITH FIDELITY NATIONAL INFORMATION SERVICES, INC. ("FIS") TO PROVIDE PAYMENT CARDS TO THE CITY TO BE PROVIDED TO APPROVED GRANT RECIPIENTS UNDER THE COVID-19 SMALL BUSINESS RELIEF GRANT PROGRAM AND THE COVID-19 SENIOR AND DISABLED FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM; REQUESTING PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2019-2020 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(C) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above is \$3,000,000 is from the Federal CARES Act Grant Funding received by the City from the Federal Government pursuant to CARES Act to provide \$2,000,000 in additional funding to the COVID-19 Small Business Relief Grant program approved in Ordinance 2020-247-E; and \$1,000,000 additional funding to the COVID-19 Senior and Disabled Financial Assistance program approved in Ordinance 2020-276-E.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in section 1 is to provide additional funding to two programs: an additional \$2,000,000 in funding for grants via pay cards to eligible small businesses located in Duval County to partially combat the economic impacts of the COVID-19 virus and encourage approved businesses to retain their employees for the duration of the declared emergencies as established by Ordinance 2020-247-E; and an additional \$1,000,000 in funding to provide grants via pay cards to provide financial assistance to senior citizens (72 years or older) and non-dependent residents with SSA-defined disabilities that are on fixed income that experienced increased expenses during the COVID-19 pandemic as established by Ordinance 2020-276-E.

Section 3. Authorizing the City to enter into an Amendment to the agreement with Fidelity National Information Services (FIS). The City is hereby authorized to enter into an Amendment to the Agreement with Fidelity National Information

Services for the purposes described in Section 2, and to also allow for a negotiated compensation to FIS. The Amendment will provide additional \$3,000,000 in funding, which will be distributed in the form of cards for the same purpose and in the same process described in 2020-247-E and 2020-276-E.

Section 4. Invoking the exception to Section 126.107(g), Ordinance Code. The City is hereby authorized to enter into the Second Amendment to the Agreement with Fidelity National Information Services, Inc. for the purposes described in Section 2, as well as allowing for a negotiated compensation to FIS. Pursuant to Section 126.107(g) (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such procurement is exempted from competitive solicitation because the supplies or services are to be provided by those specifically prescribed within authorizing legislation that appropriates the same. exception of the foregoing, all other provisions of Chapter 126, Ordinance Code, shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. Rule 4.901 Requesting Emergency Passage Upon Introduction. Emergency passage upon introduction of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that the negative health and economic impacts of COVID-19 are ongoing and immediate economic assistance is needed to maintain the viability of businesses and ease the financial needs of the citizens of Duval County impacted by COVID-19.

Section 6. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
