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## ORDINANCE 2020-315-E

AN ORDINANCE MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS AND APPROPRIATING \$25,000 FROM A CITY COUNCIL OPERATING CONTINGENCY TO PROVIDE GRANTS UP TO \$1,500 TO DOWNTOWN BUSINESSES IMPACTED BY THE CIVIL UNREST IN DOWNTOWN JACKSONVILLE BETWEEN MAY 30 - JUNE 1, 2020; PROVIDING FOR MONTHLY REPORTS TO CITY COUNCIL; PROVIDING REVERTER OF UNSPENT FUNDS; REQUESTING THAT THE FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT OVERSEE THE GRANT PROCESS AND PROGRAM; REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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WHEREAS, on May 30, 2020, a large number of individuals gathered in Downtown Jacksonville to peacefully exercise their First Amendment rights to conduct a peaceful protest; and

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WHEREAS, at the conclusion of the protest and after the majority of protesters departed, several hundred individuals began to engage police and other first responders, resulting in several police officers being attacked and one police officer getting stabbed and requiring emergency medical services; burning, destruction and defacing of public property; vandalism damage and

destruction against private property and extreme endangerment of the public health, safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, on May 31, 2020 and June 1, 2020, additional protests were held in Downtown Jacksonville; and

WHEREAS, on May 31, 2020, Mayor Lenny Curry proclaimed and declared a state of emergency exists in Duval County associated with civil unrest in order to preserve the public peace and protect the public health, safety and welfare against a repeat of the civil unrest and violent actions occurring and associated with the public demonstrations and protests currently being conducted; and

WHEREAS, the above referenced civil unrest occurred during a time where many businesses were just reopening after a declared state and national emergency to combat COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, as elsewhere in the country, the citizens and businesses of Duval County are suffering severe economic impacts stemming in part from national, state and local measures closing certain businesses, public schools, public beaches, imposing emergency work-at-home requirements and limiting public gatherings (the "Emergency Measures") in an effort to slow the infection rate of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, as a result of COVID-19 and the resulting Emergency Measures, the City desires to provide grants to eligible Downtown businesses in Jacksonville in an effort to assist affected businesses who received damage by the civil unrest between May 30 - June 1, 2020; and

WHEREAS, disbursement of the grant funds pursuant to the Program is intended to lessen the severe economic impacts of property damages experienced as a direct result of the recent civil unrest to business located in Downtown Jacksonville; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Findings. It is hereby ascertained, determined,

found and declared as follows:

- (a) The recitals set forth herein are true and correct.
- (b) By providing financial assistance for property damaged in the civil unrest period between May 30 June 1, 2020 to businesses located in Downtown Jacksonville, the Program is designed to benefit businesses affected and will promote and further the public and municipal purposes of the City and serve to limit the severe economic impacts of COVID-19.
- (c) The Program is designed to provide rapid economic relief to downtown businesses in order to maintain the viability of such businesses by allowing them to repair property damage caused from civil unrest between May 30 June 1, 2020, thus maintaining the City's tax base and revenues.
- (d) The Program will provide economic relief to downtown businesses, thus encouraging ongoing compliance with the Emergency Measures and benefitting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Duval County.
- (e) The provision of the City's assistance as identified herein is necessary and appropriate to make the Program feasible; and the City's assistance is reasonable and not excessive, taking into account the extent of the public benefits expected to be derived from the Program, and taking into account all other forms of assistance available.
- (f) The authorizations provided by this Ordinance are for public uses and purposes for which the City may use its powers as a county, municipality and as a political subdivision of the State of Florida and may expend public funds, and the necessity in the public interest for the provisions herein enacted is hereby declared as a matter of legislative determination.
- (g) This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 163, 166 and 125, Florida Statutes, as amended, the City's

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Charter, and other applicable provisions of law.

Appropriation. For the 2019-2020 fiscal year, Section 2. within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(C) Explanation of Appropriation:

> The funding above is from a City Council operating Businesses Financial contingency to the Downtown Assistance program. The funds will be used to provide financial assistance to Downtown businesses that have experienced additional expenses due to property damage during civil unrest between May 30 - June 1, 2020.

Section 3. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 2 is to provide grants to eligible Downtown businesses in Jacksonville to partially combat the economic impacts of property damage due to civil unrest and assist in financial grants to repair property damage.

Section 4. Reverter. Any funds that are not spent for the purposes set forth in this Ordinance shall revert back to the account of origin.

Section 5. Downtown Businesses Financial Assistance Program approved. For a period of two months from the effective date of this Ordinance, the City is authorized to award Financial Assistance to eligible Downtown businesses in Jacksonville in the amount up to \$1,500 to approved applicants in accordance with the criteria attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 2, labeled as "Revised 2, Revised Criteria, June 15, 2020 - NCSPHS" Exhibit incorporated herein reference. The program is designed to provide financial assistance to downtown businesses that experienced property damages as a result of the civil unrest between May 30 -June 1, 2020. The funds can be used for repairs needed due to the impacts created by the civil unrest. The City will make a one-time payment of up to \$1,500 to approved applicants. The eligibility criteria include that an applicant: (i) must be a business located in Downtown Jacksonville; (ii) demonstrate an impact of property damages or vandalism due to the civil unrest which occurred between May 30 - June 1; (iii) the applying business must own the building or represent that the business is responsible for the repairs to the property; and (iv) only one grant shall be administered for each business per address; (v) must provide a copy of the police report; (vi) must provide copies of receipts documenting repair costs or estimates for the work to be completed; and (vii) property damages must not have otherwise been mitigated/covered.

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Section 6. Oversight Department. The Finance and Administration Department shall provide oversight for the Program herein.

Section 7. Monthly Report. The Finance and Administration Department is required to make a report monthly to the City Council concerning the use of the funds authorized hereby for the Program, including the number of recipients and dollar amounts of the Grants.

Section 8. Requesting One Cycle Emergency Passage pursuant to Council Rule 4.901. One cycle emergency passage of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that the impacts of the property destruction are ongoing and immediate economic assistance will assist in the Downtown Jacksonville
