UPS, an international distribution company, has been making strategic investments in various markets			
around the U.S. in recent years, to keep up with the demands of the ecommerce marketplace. In 2017,			
the City of Jacksonville approved a REV Grant for UPS related to a proposed investment of \$196 million			
at its Imeson Road facility. Of that projected \$196 million, by the end of 2019 UPS had invested			
approximately \$173 million. UPS is now evaluating its Imeson Road location for an additional \$138			
million investment (above the original projection of \$196 million), totaling an overall investment of \$334			
million, over a 4 year period.			
UPS is evaluating sites in several other states to invest the additional \$138 million in proposed			
improvements. If Jacksonville is selected, they propose to create an additional 240 new full-time jobs no			
later than December 31, 2024. The average annual wage is \$50,000 plus benefits. UPS has stated that			
the City of Jacksonville's financial incentive proposed is a material factor in their decision to further			
develop the logistics, warehouse and distribution center in Jacksonville.			
The City is proposing to revise the 2017 REV Grant so that it reflects a total investment of \$334 million			
by the company. The terms of the REV Grant, 5 years at 50%, would remain the same. The cap would			
be increased from \$4.3 million to \$6.8 million.
