7 Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide special ESG-CV funds to be used to prevent, 8 9 prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19) 10 among individuals and families who are homeless or receiving homeless assistance, and to support additional homeless assistance 11 and homelessness prevention activities to mitigate the impacts of 12 COVID-19. In addition, the ESG-CV funds may be used to cover or 13 reimburse allowable costs incurred by a locality before the award 14 of funding, including prior to the signing of the CARES Act. Up to 15 16 ten percent (10%) of funds may be used for administrative costs.
