5 AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE KIDS HOPE
6 ALLIANCE TO PROVIDE DIRECT FUNDING IN THE
7 AMOUNT OF \$200,640.00 FOR COMMUNITIES IN
8 SCHOOLS OF JACKSONVILLE, INC. ("CIS") TO
9 PROVIDE CHILDREN'S SERVICES IN AN AFTERSCHOOL
10 AND SUMMER PROGRAM; AUTHORIZING THE KIDS HOPE
11 ALLIANCE TO CONTRACT DIRECTLY WITH CIS TO
12 PROVIDE AFTERSCHOOL AND SUMMER PROGRAMMING AT
13 CARTER G. WOODSON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL FOR THE
14 2020-2021 SCHOOL YEAR AND THE IMMEDIATELY
15 FOLLOWING SUMMER; INVOKING THE EXCEPTION TO
16 SECTION 126.107(G) (EXEMPTIONS), PART 1
17 (GENERAL REGULATIONS), CHAPTER 126
18 (PROCUREMENT CODE), *ORDINANCE CODE*, REGARDING
19 THE CHILDREN'S SERVICES PROGRAMMING TO BE
20 PROVIDED BY CIS AS SPECIFIED IN THIS
21 ORDINANCE; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS
22 DESIGNEE, AND CORPORATION SECRETARY, AND/OR
23 THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF THE KIDS HOPE
24 ALLIANCE TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER A CHILDREN'S
25 SERVICES CONTRACT WITH CIS; WAIVING THE
26 REQUIREMENTS OF CHAPTER 77 (KIDS HOPE
27 ALLIANCE), SECTION 77.111(a) (PROVIDER
28 CONTRACTS), *ORDINANCE CODE*, TO EXEMPT THE
29 CHILDREN'S SERVICES PROGRAMMING TO BE PROVIDED
30 BY CIS FROM COMPETITIVE PROCUREMENT; PROVIDING
31 AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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2 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

3 **Section 1. Background.** Communities in Schools of
4 Jacksonville, Inc. ("CIS") has operated an afterschool and summer
5 program at Carter G. Woodson Elementary School for the past three
6 years within the Out-of-School ("OST") Essential Services Category.
7 This school was not listed as a possible site in the new Request
8 For Proposal issued by the Kids Hope Alliance in March 2020 (the
9 "RFP"), as, at the time of release, Duval County Public Schools
10 ("DCPS") intended to close the school for the 2020-2021 school
11 year. Since that time, DCPS has decided to keep the school open and
12 would like students to continue to have access to these services.

13 **Section 2. Invoking the exception to Section**
14 **126.107(g) (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126**
15 **(Procurement Code), Ordinance Code.** The Kids Hope Alliance is
16 hereby authorized to directly procure children's services from CIS
17 for afterschool and summer programming at Carter G. Woodson
18 Elementary School for the 2020-2021 school year and the immediately
19 following summer in the amount of \$200,640.00. Pursuant to Section
20 126.107(g) (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126
21 (Procurement Code), *Ordinance Code*, such services are exempted from
22 competitive solicitation because the children's services to be
23 provided by CIS are being appropriated and approved in this
24 authorizing legislation.

25 **Section 3. Approval and authorization to execute.** The
26 Mayor, or his designee, the Corporation Secretary, and/or the Chief
27 Executive Officer of the Kids Hope Alliance ("CEO") are hereby
28 authorized to execute and deliver a contract with CIS for the
29 children's services described in this legislation.

30 **Section 4. Waiving the requirements of Chapter 77 (Kids**
31 **Hope Alliance), Section 77.111(a) (Provider Contracts), Ordinance**

1 **Code.** The City hereby waives the requirements of Chapter 77 (Kids
2 Hope Alliance), Section 77.111(a) (Provider Contracts), *Ordinance*
3 *Code*, with respect to the children's services contract approved and
4 authorized under Section 3 of this ordinance. Section 77.111(a)
5 requires contracts for children's services to be competitively
6 procured by the Kids Hope Alliance via an evaluated bid process.
7 This waiver is needed in order to allow the Kids Hope Alliance to
8 continue to support these CIS children's services that were not
9 eligible to be included in the Kids Hope Alliance's most recent RFP
10 for out-of-school time programming due to the DCPS' change in plans
11 for Carter G. Woodson Elementary School.

12 **Section 5. Effective Date.** This ordinance shall become
13 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
14 without the Mayor's signature.
