7 A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMEMORATING THE
8 LIFE, WORK, AND ACHIEVEMENTS OF LEGENDARY
9 RIBAUT HIGH SCHOOL TRACK COACH, EDUCATOR, AND
10 PILLAR OF THE COMMUNITY, GWENDOLYN DELORES
11 MAXWELL, FOR HER INDELIBLE CONTRIBUTIONS TO
12 RIBAUT HIGH SCHOOL SPORTS AND THE
13 JACKSONVILLE COMMUNITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE
14 DATE.

16 **WHEREAS**, Gwendolyn Delores Maxwell was born on January 25,
17 1934 in DeFuniak Springs, Florida. She was the only child of her
18 parents, Alberta Maxwell and William Richardson. Following the
19 completion of her studies at Florida Memorial College, Ms. Maxwell
20 began her life's work as an educator, sports coach, and mentor
21 touching the lives of countless students over the tenure of her
22 impressive thirty-six-year teaching career; and

23 **WHEREAS**, prior to her title-winning tenure at Ribault, Ms.
24 Maxwell taught at multiple Jacksonville area high schools,
25 including Butler, Old Stanton, and Fernandina Beach. It is her time
26 at Ribault High School as a physical education teacher and track
27 coach, however, that leaves an indelible mark on Jacksonville
28 history. She was known by her students, the athletes that she
29 taught, and her peers as being a dedicated educator and committed
30 to not only the academic and sporting successes of her students,
31 but strived to better all aspects of her students' lives; and

1 **WHEREAS**, Ms. Maxwell's career is highlighted by her excellence
2 as a track and field coach. The Ribault Trojans won their first
3 track and field state championship in 1976 when Ms. Maxwell was the
4 assistant coach of the girl's team. The following year, she took
5 over as the Head Girls Track Coach leading the Trojans to a second
6 consecutive state championship title. Ms. Maxwell would go on to
7 lead the Trojans to winning three additional state championship
8 titles in 1990, 1992, and 1993. Additionally, under Ms. Maxwell,
9 the team finished as runner-up in the state championship four times
10 in 1982, 1988, 1991, and 1995. Ms. Maxwell's Trojans won a total of
11 269 track meets, including 15 conference meets, 13 district meets
12 and 12 regional championships. Her tenure as Head Girls Track Coach
13 ended in 1997 upon her retirement; and

14 **WHEREAS**, during her coaching career, Ms. Maxwell accumulated
15 many awards and accolades. Two athletes that she coached, Chandra
16 Cheeseborough and Dannette Young, went on to compete in the
17 Olympics. Ms. Maxwell was inducted into the Ribault Athletic Hall
18 of Fame in 2018 and the Florida Athletic Coaches Association Hall
19 of Fame in 1995. She was a five-time winner of the Dairy Farmers
20 Coach of the Year Award and was the Florida representative for
21 national track coach of the year three times in 1983, 1986, and
22 1992. Furthermore, Ms. Maxwell has won more state track titles than
23 any other coach in the northeast Florida area. Following her
24 retirement, Ms. Maxwell continued to live in the Jacksonville area.
25 On June 16, 2020, Gwendolyn Delores Maxwell passed away at the age
26 of 86; now therefore

27 **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

28 **Section 1.** The City of Jacksonville hereby honors and
29 commemorates the life, work, and achievements of legendary Ribault
30 High School track coach, educator, and pillar of the community,
31 Gwendolyn Delores Maxwell, for her indelible contributions to

1 Ribault High School sports and the Jacksonville community.

2 **Section 2. Effective Date.** This Resolution shall become
3 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
4 without the Mayor's signature.
