WHEREAS, Mrs. Murrell worked as a caterer and home decorator for many years until she began teaching home economics in the Adult Studies Department at Florida Community College of Jacksonville (FCCJ). In 1989, she retired after nineteen years of successful Alene Murrell never lost her passion for composition, so with a little encouragement of friends and family, she resumed writing poetry and short stories, both real and fiction. While writing, Mrs. Murrell made time to work in the community. She served and volunteered in a wide variety of civic, religious, and social activities; and chaired many offices within those organizations. Alene Murrell, the church mother, was an active and life-long member of the Mt. Zion Missionary Baptist
