ORDINANCE 2020-379-E

7 AN ORDINANCE MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS AND 8 APPROPRIATING \$1,000,000 FROM OPERATING 9 RESERVES WITHIN THE GENERAL FUND/GENERAL SERVICE DISTRICT TO PROVIDE ONE-TIME GRANTS UP 10 TO \$10,000 EACH TO SMALL BUSINESSES LOCATED IN 11 DUVAL COUNTY WHICH WERE IMPACTED BY COVID-19 12 13 AND HAD TO TEMPORARILY CLOSE AFTER THE GOVERNOR AUTHORIZED PHASE 1 REOPENING ON MAY 14 15 4, 2020 IN ORDER TO PERFORM SANITIZATION OR 16 DEEP CLEANING MEASURES FOLLOWING EMPLOYEE OR 17 CUSTOMER EXPOSURE TO COVID-19 SO THAT THE 18 SMALL BUSINESS COULD REOPEN; PROVIDING FOR 19 MONTHLY REPORTS TO CITY COUNCIL; PROVIDING 20 FOR REVERTER OF UNSPENT FUNDS; REQUESTING THAT 21 THE FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT 22 OVERSEE THE GRANT PROCESS AND PROGRAM; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 23

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WHEREAS, as elsewhere in the country, the citizens and businesses of Duval County are suffering severe economic impacts stemming in part from national, state and local measures closing certain businesses, public schools, public beaches, imposing emergency work-at-home requirements and limiting public gatherings ("Emergency Measures") in an effort to slow the infection rate of COVID-19; and

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2 WHEREAS, on May 4, 2020, the State of Florida began its 3 limited Phase 1 reopening of businesses pursuant to Governor 4 DeSantis' Plan for Florida's Recovery; and

5 WHEREAS, since that time many local businesses have carefully 6 planned and formulated procedures for reopening to the public which 7 have included thorough cleaning guidelines as recommended by the 8 Centers for Disease Control and the use of masks and social 9 distancing to keep the public safe while in those businesses; and

10 WHEREAS, unfortunately, since the state-wide reopening 11 beginning on May 4th, several local businesses have had to close 12 temporarily when employees have either tested positive for COVID-19 13 or when employees have come in contact with customers or other 14 individuals who have tested positive for COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, in order to reopen a building or premises following such situation, many businesses have undertaken a heightened cleaning procedure to sanitize for the public and sometimes professional sanitization and cleaning companies are hired to perform the work to ensure that building or premises is sterile before reopening; and

21 WHEREAS, the costs upon small businesses to undergo such 22 additional deep cleaning procedures can be quite extensive, 23 especially when added to the correlating loss of income the 24 business faces while the business is closed for deep cleaning and 25 sanitization; and

WHEREAS, the City is mindful of the ongoing complications and business interruptions that local businesses have faced in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic and desires to use funds to provide reimbursement of the costs of sanitization and cleaning of buildings and premises associated with COVID-19 outbreak closures, up to \$10,000 per small business, provided that receipts or other

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1 corresponding documentation showing the expenditure of these costs
2 by the small business and that is not subject to reimbursement
3 through insurance, contribution, or other set off; and

WHEREAS, disbursement of the grant funds pursuant to the program outlined herein is intended to lessen the severe economic impacts of business disruptions caused as a direct result of the spread of the COVID-19 after small businesses have reopened pursuant to the State reopening schedule but then have had to close for deep cleaning and sanitization after employees or customers have tested positive with COVID-19; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Findings. It is hereby ascertained, determined, found, and declared as follows:

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(a) The recitals set forth herein are true and correct.

By providing financial reimbursement for certain small 15 (b) 16 businesses who have incurred costs of deep cleaning and sanitizing buildings or premises after the state-wide reopening on May 4, 2020 17 but had to close after an employee or customer tested positive with 18 19 COVID-19, which caused additional business interruptions and 20 expenses to the business, the program discussed herein (the "Program") is designed to benefit small businesses affected and will 21 promote and further the public and municipal purposes of the City 22 23 and serve to limit the severe economic impacts of COVID-19.

(c) The Program is designed to provide rapid economic relief to small businesses who have suffered business interruptions as a result of deep cleaning and sanitization in order to maintain the viability of such businesses, thus maintaining the City's tax base and revenues.

(d) The Program will provide economic relief to small
businesses, thus encouraging ongoing compliance with the Emergency
Measures and benefitting the health, safety and welfare of the

1 citizens of Duval County.

(e) The provision of the City's assistance as identified herein is a necessary expenditure incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to COVID-19, were not accounted for in the City's most recently approved budget, and will reimburse expenses incurred after May 4, 2020 and prior to November 1, 2020;

7 (f) The public expenditures are appropriate to make the 8 Program feasible and the City's assistance is reasonable and not 9 excessive, taking into account the extent of the public benefits 10 expected to be derived from the Program, and taking into account all 11 other forms of assistance available.

(g) The authorizations provided by this Ordinance are for public uses and purposes for which the City may use its powers as a county, municipality and as a political subdivision of the State of Florida and may expend public funds, and the necessity in the public interest for the provisions herein enacted is hereby declared as a matter of legislative determination.

(h) This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the provisions of
Chapters 163, 166 and 125, Florida Statutes, as amended, the City's
Charter, and other applicable provisions of law.

21 Section 2. Appropriation. For the 2019-2020 fiscal year, 22 within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the 23 indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to 24 the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) **Explanation of Appropriation:**

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2 The funding above is f from Operating Reserves within the General Fund/General Service District. The funds will be 3 used to provide financial assistance to Duval County 4 5 small businesses that have experienced additional expenses due to deep cleaning and sanitizing after the 6 7 state-wide reopening on May 4, 2020 and necessitated after employees or customers were exposed to COVID-19 and 8 9 the business had to close temporarily to create a sterile 10 environment for the business reopening.

Purpose. Section 3. The purpose of the appropriation in 11 Section 2 is to provide one time grants up to \$10,000 each to 12 eligible Duval County small businesses to reimburse them for 13 14 expenses incurred after the state-wide reopening on May 4, 2020 for sanitization and deep cleaning undertaken and necessitated when 15 16 employees or customers were exposed to COVID-19 and the business 17 had to close temporarily to sterilize the building and premises.

18 Section 4. Reverter. Any funds that are not spent for the 19 purposes set forth in this Ordinance by December 31, 2020 shall 20 revert back to the account of origin.

21 Section 5. Small Businesses Reimbursement Assistance 22 **Program approved.** For a period from the Effective Date of this 23 Ordinance until November 1, 2020, the City is authorized to award 24 Reimbursement Assistance to eligible Duval County small businesses 25 in a one-time grant of up \$10,000 to approved applicants in 26 accordance with the criteria attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** and 27 incorporated herein reference. The program is designed to provide 28 reimbursement of expenses to Duval County small businesses that 29 experienced additional costs related to sanitizing and deep 30 cleaning the building or premises after the state-wide reopening on May 4, 2020 and following an employee or customer testing positive 31

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for COVID-19 causing the business to temporarily close while taking 1 2 heightened measures to disinfect or sterilize the building or 3 premises. The funds can be used for the costs associated with deep cleaning and sanitization of the building, by the business or a 4 third party. The City will make a one-time payment of up to \$10,000 5 to approved applicants. The eligibility criteria include that an 6 7 applicant: (i) must be a small business located in Duval County; 8 demonstrate expenses incurred from deep cleaning (ii) and 9 sanitizing the building or premises after an employee or customer 10 tested positive for COVID-19 causing the business to temporarily close after the state-wide reopening on May 4; (iii) the applying 11 business must own the building or represent that the business is 12 13 responsible for the expenses related to deep cleaning and 14 sanitizing the premises; and (iv) only one grant shall be 15 administered for each small business per address.

16 Section 6. Oversight Department. The Finance and 17 Administration Department shall provide oversight for the Program 18 herein.

19 Section 7. Monthly Report. The Finance and 20 Administration Department is required to make a report monthly to 21 the City Council concerning the use of the funds authorized hereby 22 for the Program, including the number of recipients and dollar 23 amounts of the Grants.

Section 8. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
