AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING A CONTINUATION GRANT; APPROPRIATING \$5,450,501.00 (\$4,087,875.75 FROM THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (FEMA) THROUGH THE FLORIDA DIVISION OF **EMERGENCY** MANAGEMENT (FDEM) AND A 25% CITY MATCH OF \$1,362,625.25 FROM THE GENERAL FUND) UNDER THE HAZARD MITIGATION GRANT PROGRAM TO ACQUIRE AND DEMOLISH 22 FLOOD-PRONE PROPERTIES AND RETURN THEM TO GREEN SPACE, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 20-104; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, THE FEDERALLY-FUNDED SUBAWARD AND GRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN FDEM AND CITY OF JACKSONVILLE; AMENDING THE 2020-2024 FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM APPROVED BY ORDINANCE 2019-505-E TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE PROJECT ENTITLED "ACQUISITION & DEMO OF 22 FLOODPRONE PROPERTIES (SOUTH SHORES B)"; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS DIVISION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2019-2020 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation

The funding above is an award in the amount of \$4,087,875.75 from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) through the State of Florida Division of Emergency Management (75%) and a City match of \$1,362,625.25 from the General Fund (25%) for acquisition and demolition of 22 flood-prone structures. All funding for this project will expire June 30, 2022.

Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 2. Section 1 is to provide funding for the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program project (the "Project") to acquire and demolish 22 floodprone properties (the "Subject Properties") and return them to green space. The Subject Properties are located within the 100-year floodplain. During Hurricane Irma, this area experienced a storm surge of over three feet, which severely impacted many of the Subject Properties. Even without severe weather, this area is subject to persistent nuisance flooding. The Project will reduce future costs to the county, state, and federal agencies that provide evacuation and rescue, emergency shelter, and debris removal services, and further reduce the financial burden on taxpayers caused by repeated repairs to the Subject Properties, that were built adjacent to the St. Johns River and within the 100-year floodplain. Section 3. Authorization to execute. The Mayor, or his designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, the Federally-Funded Subaward and Grant Agreement between the Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM) and the City of Jacksonville, in substantially the same form placed On File with the Office of Legislative Services.

Section 4. CIP Amendment: Ordinance 2019-505-E, being the 2020-2024 Five-Year Capital Improvement Program for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to provide funding for the project entitled "Acquisition & Demo of 22 Flood-prone Properties (South Shores B)." The project is more fully described in the Project Information Sheet, attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference.
