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ORDINANCE 2020-518

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A MORATORIUM OF TWO YEARS ON THE RENAMING OF PUBLIC PARKS, BUILDINGS, RECREATIONAL FACILITIES, AND PUBLIC STREETS; PROVIDING THAT THE MORATORIUM REMAIN IN EFFECT FROM ENACTMENT UNTIL AUGUST 11, 2022 OR UNTIL A UNIFORM PROCEDURE OR POLICY FOR RENAMING IS IMPLEMENTED ΒY COUNCIL; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the naming or renaming of public buildings, parks, streets, and recreational facilities is complex and sometimes emotionally evocative since assigning a name is a powerful and permanent identity for a public park, street, facility or other public place; and

WHEREAS, while the City has a procedure outlined in Chapter 745, Ordinance Code, to rename public streets under certain conditions, the City does not have a current policy or procedure for renaming public buildings, parks or recreational facilities; and

WHEREAS, in recent months there has been increased interest by the public at large in the historical and institutional motivations for the names of certain public parks and buildings; and

WHEREAS, correspondingly, there has been a concerted movement to rename public parks and facilities; and

WHEREAS, the City should strive to establish a coordinated and

consistent approach to the naming and renaming of parks, public street, public buildings and recreational facilities and therefore the Council desires to place a moratorium on the renaming of public parks, streets, buildings and recreation facilities until the Council has created concerted policy or procedure; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Findings and Statement of Intent.

- (a) The above recitals are hereby adopted as the Council's Findings of Fact; and
- (b) The Council will be undertaking a review of the City's current laws governing the renaming of streets, buildings and parks and recreational facilities pursuant to Chapters 122 and 745, Ordinance Code, and any other applicable Code provisions.
- Section 2. Moratorium Imposed. The Council hereby imposes up to a two-year moratorium on the renaming of public buildings, parks, recreational facilities, and public streets. This moratorium shall apply to all applications for street renaming or for requests made to rename public parks, public buildings or recreational facilities submitted after August 11, 2020. The Council also agrees to refrain from filing legislation requesting the renaming of public buildings, parks, recreational facilities, and public streets during the period of the moratorium.
- Section 3. Duration of Moratorium. This moratorium shall remain in effect from enactment until August 11, 2022 unless the Council adopts a policy or procedure to address the renaming of public buildings, parks, recreational facilities, and public streets prior to this time in which case the moratorium will cease.
- Section 4. Requesting Emergency Passage Upon Introduction

 Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. Emergency passage upon introduction of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that the City does not have policies in place for

public buildings, parks, and recreational facilities but has received requests to make name changes to several parks. The Council desires to place a hold on making decisions for any renaming application filed or requested after the Council meeting on August 11, 2020 so that a consistent and coordinated approach to renaming requests can be made by the City.

Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
