AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$45,130.14 FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY/FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (FEMA) THROUGH THE FLORIDA DIVISION OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT (FDEM) TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE PURCHASE OF A HEAVY DUTY TOW VEHICLE FOR THE INFECTIOUS DISEASE RESPONSE UNIT, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 20-105; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY EXECUTE AND DELIVER, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, THE FEDERALLY-FUNDED SUBAWARD AND GRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN FDEM AND CTTY OF JACKSONVILLE; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY THE EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS DIVISION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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(c) Explanation of Appropriation

The funding above is a Fiscal Year 2020 Emergency Management Performance Grant Program COVID-19 Supplemental (EMPG-S) in the amount of \$45,130.14 from t.he U. S. Department of Homeland Security/Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) through the State of Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM) for the purchase of a heavy duty tow vehicle for the Infectious Disease Response Unit.

The purpose of the EMPG-S is to Section 2. Purpose. assist local governments with their public health and emergency management activities supporting the prevention of, preparation for, and response to the ongoing Coronavirus Disease 2019 public health emergency. The appropriation in Section 1 will be used to purchase one heavy duty tow vehicle for the Infectious Disease support the Response Team that will Emergency Preparedness Division's logistics and supply chain management for COVID-19 public health response operations, such as alternate care sites, points of dispensing and distribution, healthcare facility PPE, and COVID-19 screening and testing sites. The grant period expires June 30, 2021.

Section 3. Approval and authorization. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, the Federally-Funded Subaward and Grant Agreement between the Division of Emergency Management and City of Jacksonville, in substantially the same form placed ON FILE with the Office of Legislative Services.

Section 4. Oversight. The Emergency Preparedness Division will provide oversight.

Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become
