5 AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$45,130.14 FROM THE
6 DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY/FEDERAL
7 EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (FEMA) THROUGH THE
8 FLORIDA DIVISION OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT
9 (FDEM) TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE PURCHASE OF
10 A HEAVY DUTY TOW VEHICLE FOR THE INFECTIOUS
11 DISEASE RESPONSE UNIT, AS INITIATED BY B.T.
12 20-105; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS
13 DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO
14 EXECUTE AND DELIVER, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE
15 CITY, THE FEDERALLY-FUNDED SUBAWARD AND GRANT
16 AGREEMENT BETWEEN FDEM AND CITY OF
17 JACKSONVILLE; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY
18 THE EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS DIVISION; PROVIDING
19 AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
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21 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

22 **Section 1. Appropriation.** For the 2019-2020 fiscal year,
23 within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the
24 indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to
25 the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

1 (c) Explanation of Appropriation

2 The funding above is a Fiscal Year 2020 Emergency
3 Management Performance Grant Program COVID-19
4 Supplemental (EMPG-S) in the amount of \$45,130.14 from
5 the U. S. Department of Homeland Security/Federal
6 Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) through the State of
7 Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM) for the
8 purchase of a heavy duty tow vehicle for the Infectious
9 Disease Response Unit.

10 **Section 2. Purpose.** The purpose of the EMPG-S is to
11 assist local governments with their public health and emergency
12 management activities supporting the prevention of, preparation
13 for, and response to the ongoing Coronavirus Disease 2019 public
14 health emergency. The appropriation in Section 1 will be used to
15 purchase one heavy duty tow vehicle for the Infectious Disease
16 Response Team that will support the Emergency Preparedness
17 Division's logistics and supply chain management for COVID-19
18 public health response operations, such as alternate care sites,
19 points of dispensing and distribution, healthcare facility PPE, and
20 COVID-19 screening and testing sites. The grant period expires June
21 30, 2021.

22 **Section 3. Approval and authorization.** There is hereby
23 approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and Corporation Secretary
24 are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of
25 the City, the Federally-Funded Subaward and Grant Agreement between
26 the Division of Emergency Management and City of Jacksonville, in
27 substantially the same form placed **ON FILE** with the Office of
28 Legislative Services.

29 **Section 4. Oversight.** The Emergency Preparedness Division
30 will provide oversight.

31 **Section 5. Effective Date.** This ordinance shall become

1 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
2 without the Mayor's signature.
