ORDINANCE 2020-528

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 108.507 (REPRESENTATION OF CITY OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES IN CIVIL MATTERS), PART 5 (LEGAL SERVICES), CHAPTER 108 (CENTRAL SERVICES), ORDINANCE CODE, TO INCLUDE A PROVISION FOR NOTICE TO THE OFFICE OF GENERAL COUNSEL IF AN INDIVIDUAL INTENDS TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR OUTSIDE ATTORNEY'S FEES FROM THE CITY FOR CIVIL OR CRIMINAL ACTIONS; PROVISION REGARDING RIGHTS UNDER FLORIDA COMMON LAW AND REGARDING CRIMINAL ACTIONS OR CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Amending Section 108.507 (Representation of City Section 1. Officials and employees in civil matters), Part 5 (Legal Services), Chapter 108 (Central Services), Ordinance Code. Section 108.507 (Representation of City Officials and employees in civil matters), Chapter 108 (Central Services), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:

## CHAPTER 108. CENTRAL SERVICES

## PART 5. LEGAL SERVICES

Sec. 108.507. - Representation of City Officials and employees in civil and criminal matters or investigations.

The Office of General Counsel is authorized, without the (a)

necessity of Council approval, to represent elected and appointed officials and employees of the City (herein referred to collectively as "Official") in civil or criminal actions or investigations filed in any state or federal court if it determines that the civil or criminal action or investigation is based upon an act or omission of the official done by him or her or his or her authorized deputy or agent while performing an official duty of his or her office, whether or not this official capacity is alleged in the complaint. For purposes of this section, the term civil or criminal action or investigation includes administrative proceedings and investigations and the term state or federal courts includes an administrative tribunal. However, nothing in this section authorizes the Office of General Counsel to provide representation in a filed criminal matter on behalf of an accused who has been indicted or otherwise formally charged with a crime.

(b) An Official who has a common law right to retain outside legal counsel to represent him or her in a civil or criminal action or investigation based upon an act or omission of the Official done by him or her in their official employment or official duty of his or her office and intends to seek reimbursement of the reasonable attorney's fees associated with retaining outside legal counsel shall provide notification to the Office of General Counsel within thirty (30) days of engagement or retainer of outside counsel by sending notification to the Office of General Counsel by certified mail. Provided however, any individual who has hired outside counsel prior to October 1, 2020, shall have thirty (30) days from October 1, 2020 to provide notice to the Office of General Counsel by

certified mail if they intend to seek reimbursement from the City for their legal fees related to such action. "Reasonable attorney's fees" as used herein shall mean the fees earned by an attorney licensed to practice law in the State of Florida while based on the customary per hour rate charged within the City of Jacksonville for similar work, but in no event to exceed \$350.00 per hour.

- (c) If an Official does not provide the notification in subsection (b) within the time prescribed therein, and seeks reimbursement by the City of the reasonable attorney's fees associated with retaining outside legal counsel, the appropriation of the reasonable attorney's fees reimbursed to the Official must be submitted to Council for approval through legislation.
- (d) On an annual basis beginning on October 1, 2021, the Office of General Counsel will submit a report to the Council on a yearly basis which will fix the customary market rate for establishing reasonable attorney's fees for purposes of reimbursement under subsection (b) above.

and criminal actions or criminal investigations. Nothing provided for herein should be construed as diminishing or expanding the limited right to reimbursement of reasonable attorney's fees as established under Florida common law for civil and criminal actions or investigations. Moreover, nothing in this section shall be construed to require reimbursement of fees prior to the final resolution of an action or investigation as it relates to the individual seeking reimbursement.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
