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AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$2,627,267.00 CORONAVIRUS AID, RELIEF, AND ECONOMIC SECURITY (CARES) PASS-THROUGH FUNDING DISTRIBUTED BY FLORIDA HOUSING FINANCE CORPORATION (FHFC) TO, TO BE ADMINSITERED BY, THE CITY PROVIDE JACKSONVILLE TO HOUSING-RELATED ASSISTANCE TO ELIGIBLE HOUSEHOLDS EXPERIENCING HARDSHIPS BECAUSE OF THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 20-111; APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER ON BEHALF OF THE CITY THE CORONAVIRUS RELIEF FUND (CRF) SUBRECIPIENT AGREEMENT AND ANY RELATED AND SUBSEQUENT AGREEMENTS ALLOCATING ADDITIONAL FUNDS FROM FHFC; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DIVISION OF THE NEIGHBORHOODS DEPARTMENT; REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2019-2020 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation

The funding above is an appropriation of Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) pass-through funding distributed by Florida Housing Finance Corporation to, and to be adminsitered by, the City of Jacksonville to provide housing-related assistance to eligible households experiencing hardships because of the COVID-19 pandemic. There is no match for these funds. Any eligible activities that occur between March 1, 2020, and December 30, 2020, are CRF eligible. All funds must be expended by no later than December 30, 2020. All funds that are not expended by December 30, 2020, will be returned to Florida Housing Finance Corporation and in turn to the U. S. Treasury Department.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to to provide housing-related assistance to eligible households experiencing hardships because of the COVID-19 pandemic. The overarching requirement of all CARES funding is that it must be spent on activities necessary due to the COVID-19 emergency. Activities such as rental and mortgage assistance payments or payments for emergency repairs (and related counseling) for persons who have experienced hardships that prevent them from making these payments are eligible uses. Beyond that, activities such as new construction may be eligible if related specifically to a need caused by the COVID-19 emergency and proposed to and approved by Florida Housing Finance Corporation prior to implementation. 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local government may use up to 10% for administrative costs as well as reasonable delivery costs for services provided by third party individuals or organizations that perform a required task that local government cannot perform in the restricted timeframe without assistance.

Section 3. Approval and authorization. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver on behalf of the City the Coronavirus Relief Fund (CRF) Subrecipient Agreement, in substantially the same form placed ON FILE with the Office of Legislative Services, and any related and subsequent agreements allocating additional funds from FHFC.

Section 4. Oversight. The Housing and Community Development Division of the Neighborhoods Department shall oversee the Program.

Section 5. Requesting one cycle emergency passage pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency passage of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that all funds must be fully expended by December 30, 2020.

Section 6. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
