EUGENE PORTER, FOR HIS **EVERLASTING** CONTRIBUTIONS TO RAINES HIGH SCHOOL, JACKSONVILLE COMMUNITY, AND HIS COUNTRY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, Robert Eugene Porter was born on November 7, 1931. A native of Chicago, Illinois in his youth, Mr. Porter attended the Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University (FAMU) in the early 1950s. While at FAMU, Mr. Porter was a lead member of the world renowned "Marching 100" marching band and in 1951 was inducted into the illustrious Upsilon Psi Chapter, of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity; and

WHEREAS, upon his graduation from FAMU in 1954, Mr. Porter joined the United States Army as a Second Lieutenant. He served in the Army from 1954 to 1975 becoming a highly decorated service member and reaching the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. During his illustrious military career, Lt. Col. Porter had countless achievements and highlights, including serving as the commanding officer of the renowned 82nd Airborne Division at Fort Bragg, NC and earning two Bronze Stars for his valor in service during the Vietnam War; and

Porter took his leadership skills to Jacksonville where he started working as the Senior Army Instructor at the historically black William M. Raines High School. His tenure at Raines High School lasted until his retirement in 2015. Upon Lt. Col.
