21	Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in	

21 Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in 22 Section 1 is to provide funding for the Hazard Mitigation Grant 23 Program project (the "Project") to acquire and demolish 22 flood-24 prone properties (the "Subject Properties") and return them to 25 green space and to provide funding for relocation assistance in 26 accordance with 49 CFR Part 24 Uniform Relocation Assistance and 27 Property Acquisition for Federal and Federally-Assisted Real Programs. The Subject Properties are located within the 100-year 28 29 floodplain. During Hurricane Irma, this area experienced a storm 30 surge of over three feet, which severely impacted many of the 31 Subject Properties. Even without severe weather, this area is

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subject to persistent nuisance flooding. The Project will reduce 1 future costs to the county, state, and federal agencies that 2 3 provide evacuation and rescue, emergency shelter, and debris removal services, and further reduce the financial burden on 4 5 taxpayers caused by repeated repairs to the Subject Properties, that were built adjacent to the St. Johns River and within the 100-6 7 year floodplain. 26 2233 Guilford Road 32207. The Subject Properties will be deed-27 restricted so as not to allow new structures to be built that 28 inevitably would be damaged by future flooding.

29 Section 3. Authorization to execute. The Mayor, or his 30 designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to 31 execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, the Federally-

Funded Subaward and Grant Agreement between the Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM) and the City of Jacksonville, in substantially the same form placed **On File** with the Office of Legislative Services.

Section 4. CIP Amendment: Ordinance 2019-505-E, being the 5 2020-2024 Five-Year Capital Improvement Program for the City and 6 7 certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to provide funding for the project entitled "Acquisition & Demo of 22 Flood-8 9 prone Properties (South Shores B)." The project is more fully 10 described in the Project Information Sheet, attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 2, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 2, Revised CIP, 11 September 14, 2020 - NCSPHS" and incorporated herein by this 12 reference. The Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of 13 the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be 14 detrimental to the best interests of the community because such 15 deferral will result in the City's loss of needed grant dollars. 16 Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this 17 ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the 18 19 Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This ordinance shall constitute an 20 21 amendment to Ordinance 2019-505-E. In all other respects, the Five-22 Year Capital Improvement Program approved by Ordinance 2019-505-E shall continue in full force and effect. 23

24 Section 5. Oversight. Emergency Preparedness Division
25 will provide oversight.

Section 6. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
