AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$682,795.88 (\$620,723.53 FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY/FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY A 10 (FEMA) AND PERCENT CITY MATCH \$62,072.35 FROM GENERAL FUND OPERATING RESERVES FOR FEDERAL PROGRAMS) TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE PURCHASE OF PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE), INCLUDING OPERATING AND MEDICAL SUPPLIES, IN RESPONSE TO THECORONAVIRUS DISEASE (COVID-19), AS INITIATED BY B.T. 20-106; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER, FOR AND ON CITY, BEHALF OF THETHEFEDERALLY-FUNDED SUBAWARD AND GRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN FDEM AND CITY OF JACKSONVILLE; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY THEEMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS DIVISION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2019-2020 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation

The funding above is a Fiscal Year 2020 Assistance to Firefighters Grant COVID-19 Supplemental (AFG-S) from the U. S. Department of Homeland Security/Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) \$620,723.53) and a 10 percent match from the General Fund Operating Reserves for Federal Programs (\$62,072.35) to provide funds for the purchase of personal protective equipment (PPE) and related supplies, including reimbursements, to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus (COVID-19).

Section 2. Purpose. The AFG-S is a supplemental funding opportunity under the Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program (AFG). AFG is one of three grant programs that constitute the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) focus on enhancing the safety of the public and firefighters with respect to fire and fire-related hazards. AFG-S Program accomplishes this by providing financial assistance directly to eligible fire departments for critical personal protective equipment and supplies needed to respond to the COVID-19 public health emergency. The grant funding in Section 1 will assist the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department with reimbursement for PPE purchased for COVID-19 response from January 1, 2020, through March 30, 2020 (\$197,895.88), and also provide funding for future expenditures for PPE related to COVID-19 response (\$484,900.00). The grant period expires July 2, 2021.

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Approval and authorization. Section 3. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, the Federally-Funded Subaward and Grant Agreement between the Florida Division of Emergency Management and City of Jacksonville, in substantially the same form placed On File with the Office of Legislative Services.

Oversight. The Emergency Preparedness Division Section 4. will provide oversight.

Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
