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ORDINANCE 2020-625

5 AN ORDINANCE MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS AND 6 AUTHORIZING: (1) THE BORROWING OF UP TO AN ADDITIONAL AMOUNT OF \$41,500,000 IN ADDITION TO 7 THE BORROWING AUTHORIZED BY ORDINANCE 2020-8 FOR THE LOT J DEVELOPMENT PROJECT, TO PROVIDE 9 IMMEDIATE FUNDING FOR CERTAIN CIP PROJECTS 10 11 THROUGHOUT THE CITY AND (2) THE APPROPRIATION OF \$41,500,000 OF BORROWED FUNDS TO MOVE UP THE 12 13 FUNDING OF AND PROVIDE ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR 14 CERTAIN PROJECTS INCLUDED IN THE CITY'S FIVE 15 YEAR 2021-2025 CIP; REVISING ORDINANCE 2020-505-16 E, THE CITY'S FIVE YEAR 2021-2025 CIP TO MOVE 17 UP THE FUNDING OF AND PROVIDE ADDITIONAL FUNDING 18 FOR CERTAIN PROJECTS ENUMERATED HEREIN; 19 REQUESTING THAT THE FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT ADMINISTER THE BORROWING AUTHORIZED 20 21 HEREIN; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Jacksonville, Florida (the "Council") is considering Ordinance 2020-____ to authorize funding for borrowing up to \$208.3 million for the Lot J Development Project ("Lot J") and also to finance the construction of certain infrastructure improvements for Lot J, as more fully described in Ordinance 2020- ; and

WHEREAS, the Lot J project is lauded to strengthen the local economy by adding to the workforce and contributing to the development of surrounding neighborhoods but meanwhile other road, transportation and infrastructure projects are needed throughout Jacksonville as evidenced by the projects contained in the City's 2021-2025 Capital Improvement Plan ("CIP") and water/wastewater systems projects continue to need additional funding over a period of many years; and

5 WHEREAS, strategic investment in infrastructure projects and 6 water/wastewater systems projects throughout the community would also 7 benefit the City by adding employment opportunities to construct such 8 projects and would render the areas where these improvements are made 9 more attractive to future economic development; and

WHEREAS, the Council desires to authorize additional borrowing permitted in Ordinance 2020-____, up to an additional \$41.5 million for the particular projects ("City-wide Improvements") indicated in Exhibit 1 attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein; and

WHEREAS, the Council finds that the additional borrowing for the City-wide improvements will provide significant economic benefits to the City and its residents by providing increased economic activity and will spur development in those areas in the City of Jacksonville and thus constitutes a valid governmental undertaking of the City for municipal purposes; and

20 WHEREAS, the authorizing of additional borrowing to undertake 21 the City-wide Improvements is in the public interest and the financial 22 assistance contemplated herein take into account and give 23 consideration to the long-term public interests and public interest 24 benefits to be achieved by the City; now therefore

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BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

26 Section 1. Findings. It is hereby ascertained, determined, 27 found and declared as follows:

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(a) The recitals set forth herein are true and correct.

(b) The City-wide Improvements will promote and further thepublic and municipal purposes of the City.

(c) Enhancement of the City's tax base and revenues, are

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matters of State and City policy and State and City concern in order 1 2 that the State and its counties and municipalities, including the 3 City, shall not continue to be endangered by unemployment, 4 underemployment, economic recession, poverty, crime and disease, and 5 consume an excessive proportion of the State and City revenues because of the extra services required for police, fire, accident, health 6 7 care, elderly care, charity care, hospitalization, public housing and housing assistance, and other forms of public protection, services 8 9 and facilities.

(d) The provision of additional borrowing is necessary and appropriate to make the City-wide Improvements feasible; and the City's assistance is reasonable and not excessive, taking into account the extent of the public benefits expected to be derived from the City-wide Improvements, and taking into account all other forms of assistance available.

(e) The authorizations provided by this Ordinance are for public uses and purposes for which the City may use its powers as a county, municipality and as a political subdivision of the State of Florida and may expend public funds, and the necessity in the public interest for the provisions herein enacted is hereby declared as a matter of legislative determination.

(f) This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the provisions of
Chapters 163, 166 and 125, Florida Statutes, as amended, the City's
Charter, and other applicable provisions of law.

25 Section 2. Authorizing Additional Borrowing and City-wide 26 Improvements. The City is hereby authorized to borrow, in addition 27 to the borrowing authorized by Ordinance 2020-___, an additional 28 maximum amount of up to \$41,500,000 for purposes to fund the City-29 wide Improvements as described in Exhibit 1.

30 Section 3. Appropriation. For the 2020-2021 fiscal year, 31 within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated

(c) Explanation of Appropriation: The funding above appropriates \$41,500,000 of borrowed funds that will be used to move up funding and provide additional funding for various City-wide improvements.

13 Section 4. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in 14 Section 3 is to move up funding totaling \$2 million in each district 15 (with the exception of District 11 who has total funding of only 16 \$500,000 in the 5-year CIP, including the 5th year and beyond column) for projects included in each of the Council districts of the FY 17 2020/21 Five Year Capital Improvement Program to the FY 2020/21, for 18 a total of \$26.5 million. In addition to the \$26.5 million, the 19 proposed borrowing includes additional funding of \$15 million for the 20 21 Water/Waste Water System project for septic tank phase-out.

CIP Amendment. Ordinance 2020-505-E, being the 22 Section 5. 23 2021-2025 Five-Year Capital Improvement Program for the City and 24 certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to provide 25 funding for the projects indicated in **Exhibit 1.** The Council finds 26 that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual 27 budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the community because such deferral will result in the City's loss 28 in economic opportunities and economic development which will result 29 30 in the implementation of the City-wide Improvements. Pursuant to 31 Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this ordinance

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requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2020-505-E. In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Program approved by Ordinance 2020-505-E shall continue in full force and effect.

7 Section 6. Oversight Department. The Finance and 8 Administration Department shall provide oversight for the manner of 9 borrowing permitted herein to complete the City-wide Improvements.

Section 7. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
