A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMEMORATING THE LIFE AND WORK OF JACKSONVILLE NATIVE, WALTER LEE WILLIAMS JR., FOR HIS DEDICATED COMMUNITY SERVICE AS A FORMER CITY COUNCIL PRESIDENT, JEA BOARD CHAIR, AND U.S. MARINE; AND FOR HIS ENTREPRENEURIAL LEGACY WITHIN THE JACKSONVILLE COMMUNITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, Walter Lee Williams Jr. was born on June 25th, 1936 in Jacksonville, Florida to his loving parents Walter and Etta Williams. After growing up in his hometown of Jacksonville, Mr. Williams attended the University of Florida prior to serving two years with the U.S. Marines; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Williams was a pivotal figure in Jacksonville's real estate industry for many years, having founded multiple real estate companies that handled residential, commercial, and property management real estate. He was the president of the Jacksonville Association of Realtors (JAR) in 1986 and the first president of the Northeast Florida Association of Realtors (NEFAR) in 1998. During his tenure with NEFAR, Mr. Williams served on nearly every committee, council, and task force that they organization offered. Additionally, he earned the status of Realtor Emeritus by the National Association of Realtors; and

WHEREAS, along with his entrepreneurial excellence, Williams was a dedicated public servant. He served on the first 2
