ΑN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING A \$450,000.00 TRANSITIONAL HOUSING ASSISTANCE GRANT FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, OFFICE ON VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN, WITH NO LOCAL MATCH, TO PROVIDE TRANSITIONAL HOUSING ASSISTANCE AND SUPPORTIVE SERVICES TO VICTIMS OF CERTAIN TYPES CRIMES, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 21-009; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER CONTRACTS WITH CHANGING HOMELESSNESS, INC., HUBBARD HOUSE, INC., AND OTHER QUALIFIED LOCAL SERVICE PROVIDERS WHO WILL PARTNER WITH THE CITY TO PROVIDE THE SERVICES DESCRIBED IN THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY THE PARKS, RECREATION AND COMMUNITY SERVICES SERVICES DIVISION; DEPARTMENT, SOCIAL PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2020-2021 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation
The funding above is a Transitional Housing Assistance
Program grant (the "Grant") from the U.S. Department of
Justice, Office on Violence Against Women, with no local
match.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to fund the provision of transitional housing and supportive services to victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking and human trafficking during the grant period beginning October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2023. These services will assist victims of these crimes in transitioning from homelessness to permanent housing and are anticipated to continue for a minimum period of six months up to twenty-four months per client. Additionally, the grant will be marketed to target clients who are disabled, specifically those who are deaf or hard-of-hearing. A copy of the Grant Award has been placed On File with the Office of Legislative Services.

Section 3. Approval and authorization to execute. The Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver contracts with Changing Homelessness, Inc., Hubbard House, Inc., and other qualified local provider agencies who will partner with the City to provide the services described in this ordinance.

Section 4. Oversight Department. The Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department, Social Services Division, shall

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oversee administration of the grant.

Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
