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15	Section 1. Creating a new Chapter 79 (Jacksonville City
16	Council Citizen Review Board), Ordinance Code. Chapter 79
17	(Jacksonville City Council Citizen Review Board), Ordinance Code, is
18	hereby created to read as follows:

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21 22	(a) <i>Creation</i> . There is hereby established a City Council Citizen Review Board for the City of Jacksonville ("CRB").
21 22 23	 (a) Creation. There is hereby established a City Council Citizen Review Board for the City of Jacksonville ("CRB"). (b) Purpose and declaration of policy. The purpose of the CRB is to
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advisory only and shall not represent the policy or other official position of the City of Jacksonville unless and until enacted by the City Council and approved by the Mayor.

4 (c) Duties and responsibilities.

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- (1) To review completed administrative investigations by the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office ("JSO").
- 7 (2) Through review of completed JSO investigations, to
 8 determine whether the investigation and disposition of the
 9 case was consistent with JSO policies and procedures and
 10 report findings to the City Council.
- Through review of completed JSO investigations, the CRB 11 (3) may make recommendations to the City Council regarding 12 JSO's handling of investigations or other issues 13 of and determine whether any 14 importance, revisions or 15 additions to the City's Ordinance Code, the City Charter or other legislative action is necessary to address 16 recommendations of the CRB to City Council. 17
- 18 (4) To report its findings and recommendations to the City
 19 Council, with copies of its reports and recommendations
 20 submitted to the Mayor and the Sheriff.
- 21 (d) Membership and organization.
- 22 Persons appointed to the CRB ("Members") are volunteers (1)23 and shall receive no compensation. The CRB shall consist 24 of fourteen (14) voting members, all of which shall be 25 confirmed by Council. Each District Council Person shall 26 be entitled to file legislation proffering one (1) member 27 for appointment as a representative from that District, 2.8 subject to confirmation by the Council. Each Member may 29 serve up to two (2) two-year (2) terms ending on September 30 of the corresponding year. The initial term of each 30 Member shall be staggered so that the Members appointed by 31

1a District Council Person with an even-numbered district2will be appointed to a first full two-year (2) term while3the Members appointed by a District Council Person with an4odd-numbered district will serve one (1) partial two-year5(2) term with the ability to seek two (2) additional full-6year terms.

- (2) The CRB shall elect a chairperson ("Chair") from among its members. The CRB shall also elect a Vice-Chair from among its members. The Vice-Chair shall preside over the meeting in the absence of the chair.
- 11 (3) JSO may select a designated liaison to attend the CRB 12 meetings and sit as a non-voting member of the CRB to 13 provide expertise and assistance in understanding JSO 14 policies and procedures.
- 15 Qualifications. CRB Members shall not be a City of Jacksonville (e) employee, be directly related to a city employee as defined by 16 17 the City of Jacksonville's Code of Ethics, have been previously employed by the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office, currently work 18 for any law enforcement agency, be an attorney who litigates 19 20 matters against the City, its independent agencies, or any 21 employees of the City or its independent agencies, hold 22 political office or be campaigning for office, or have any prior 23 felony convictions or any conviction involving moral turpitude. 24 Members shall meet the following criteria:
- 25 (1) Be at least 18 years of age.

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- (2) Be a current resident of the City of Jacksonville, or, own or be a principal in a business or a not-for-profit organization in the City of Jacksonville.
 - (3) Complete a written application for appointment.
- 30 (4) Agree to devote a minimum of twelve (12) hours to
 31 participate in a ride along with JSO patrol officers, in

- 1 at least four (4) of the six (6) JSO zones, within six (6) 2 months of appointment to the CRB. 3 (5) Members shall conduct themselves in accordance with the City of Jacksonville Code of Ethics. 4 5 (6) Members who no longer satisfy the above criteria, including the prohibitions stated above, shall be removed by the 6 7 Council. 8 (f) Meetings. 9 (1) The CRB shall meet at a minimum on a quarterly basis, 10 preferably monthly. All meetings of the CRB shall be open to the public in 11 (2) accordance with the requirements of the Government-in-the-12 Sunshine Law. 13 (3) The actions of the CRB shall not conflict with the 14 provisions of F.S. §§ 112.532 and 112.533, known as the 15 Law Enforcement and Correctional Officers' Bill of Rights 16 17 or any other rights afforded pursuant to Florida law or collective bargaining agreements. Nor shall the CRB's 18 actions conflict or interfere with active civil or criminal 19 20 cases or employment matters before an arbitrator or panel 21 of arbitrators or the Civil Services Board or the Florida 22 Division of Administrative Hearings. 23 (4) The CRB may adopt rules by majority vote to govern 24 procedures relating to its operation and the conduct of 25 its meetings. The latest edition of Robert's Rules of Order
- 26 Newly Revised shall govern the proceedings in all cases
 27 not provided for.
- (g) Administrative authority, powers and duties. The provisions of this section will be administered by the citizen review board coordinator ("coordinator"), who shall be a City Council employee designated by the Director of City Council to assist

the CRB. The coordinator's duties include, but are not limited to, the following:

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- 3 Maintain a thorough understanding of JSO policies and (1)governing collective 4 procedures, the bargaining 5 agreements, the Law Enforcement and Correctional Officers' Bill of Rights, the Government-in-the-Sunshine Law, the 6 7 Public Records Law, the State and City Codes of Ethics, 8 and the City Charter.
- 9 (2) Assist with the training of CRB members in accordance with 10 the requirements of this section. Training topics may include, but shall not be limited to: JSO's written 11 directives, policies, procedures, and training; Florida 12 Statutes; JSO Integrity and Internal Affairs Units' 13 investigation processes and grievance procedures; 14 and 15 public records and exceptions.
 - (3) Prepare the agenda for each meeting in accordance with procedures approved by the CRB, as well as background information required for CRB members.
- Provide appropriate public notice of meetings and agendas. 19 (4) 20 (5) Serve as the administrative liaison between the CRB and 21 the Council, assist with communications with the Mayor and 22 the Sheriff, and finalize the CRB findings, 23 recommendations, and reports to the Council, with copies 24 going to the Mayor and the Sheriff. On an annual basis, 25 the coordinator shall file a written summary report to City 26 Council informing the City Council of the number and nature 27 of matters considered by the CRB, the recommendations made 2.8 to the City Council, as well as the matters forwarded to 29 the Mayor and the Sheriff and the official response of JSO to the recommendations, if any. 30

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become
