AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$1,130,000 FROM SPECIAL EVENTS FLORIDA GEORGIA GAME CONTINGENCY TO PROVIDE FUNDING IN CONNECTION THE 2020 FLORIDA-GEORGIA NCAA COLLEGE FOOTBALL GAME TO BE HELD AT TIAA BANK FIELD, INITIATED BY B.T. 21-022; PURPOSE APPROPRIATION; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE DELIVER A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING AMONG THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE, THE UNIVERSITY ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION, INC., AND THE UNIVERSITY OF GEORGIA ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION, INC., TO AMEND CERTAIN FINANCIAL AND OTHER TERMS AMONG THE PARTIES UNDER THE EXISTING AGREEMENT AS TO THE 2020 GAME ONLY; REQUESTING **EMERGENCY** PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE SPORTS AND ENTERTAINMENT OFFICE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Field through the 2021 game; and

WHEREAS, in October of 2019, the University of Florida, the University of Georgia (collectively, the "Schools"), and the City reached an agreement in principal (the "New Agreement") for the City to continue hosting the annual Florida-Georgia NCAA football game at TIAA Bank Field, with the revised terms commencing with the 2020 game and extending through the 2025 game; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Schools and the City did not finalize the New Agreement in time for the City to file legislation seeking its approval so that the new economic and other terms will apply to the 2020 game; and

WHEREAS, the Schools and the City wish to enter into the MOU attached hereto as Exhibit 1 to provide for revised economic and other terms as set forth therein applicable to the 2020 game, as a result of the impacts COVID-19 will have on the game, including reduced seating capacity at TIAA Bank Field, reduced ticket revenues and reduced sponsorship opportunities and economic impact activity traditionally associated with the annual game, with all other terms and conditions of the current Agreement remaining unchanged; and

WHEREAS, the Schools and the City will finalize the New Agreement in the near future and the City will subsequently file legislation seeking to authorize the City to enter into the New Agreement; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2020-2021 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation

The appropriation authorizes a minimum guarantee of \$600,000 to each school and \$400,000 for advertising and promotion for the 2021 game.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide a base payment of \$600,000 to each school and \$400,000 for advertising and promotion costs for the 2021 game.

Authorization. The Mayor, or his designee, Section 3. and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver that certain Memorandum of Understanding for the 2020 game ("MOU") between and among the City of Jacksonville ("City"), the University Athletic Association, Inc., and University of Georgia Athletic Association, Inc., in substantially the form attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and incorporated herein. The MOU supersedes certain economic and other terms as set forth in the Agreement as to the 2020 game only, and provides for each school to receive an adjusted guarantee of \$600,000 (reduced from \$1,000,000 as proposed for the New Agreement), providing \$400,000 in advertising and promotion costs for the 2021 game, reducing the number of tickets to be purchased by the City for the 2020 game from 1,000 to 300, and insuring compliance with COVID-19 public gathering protocols, with all others terms and conditions of the existing Agreement remaining unchanged.

Section 4. Requesting emergency passage upon introduction pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. Emergency passage upon introduction of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that the Georgia-Florida game is scheduled to be
