WITH ALL CARES ACT GRANT FUNDING REQUIREMENTS AND OTHER REQUIREMENTS AS PROVIDED BY LAW; WAIVING SECTION 110.112 (ADVANCE OF CITY FUNDS; PROHIBITION AGAINST), PART 1 (THE CITY TREASURY), CHAPTER 110 (CITY TREASURY), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW FOR ADVANCE PAYMENT BY THE CITY; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING

(c) Explanation of Appropriation

The funding above is a transfer of Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security ("CARES") Act grant funding 1

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from the Vystar Small Business Relief Program that is no longer needed based on current utilization and from contractual services in Testing and other Health Needs to create a new Eviction and Foreclosure Prevention Program.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding to create a new Eviction and Foreclosure Prevention Program (the "Program") to assist individuals and businesses impacted by COVID-19 who are facing potential eviction or foreclosure, as more fully described in the Program Terms/Scope of Services and Budget, attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference and subject to applicable CARES Act grant funding requirements. The Program will be managed by The Jacksonville Bar Association, Inc. Individual applicants may qualify for up to \$5,000.00 for bank-owed rent/mortgage payments, and businesses may qualify for up to \$10,000.00 for same. The funds appropriated herein shall allocated as follows: 2/3 for individual applicants and 1/3 for business applicants.

approved. The Program Terms/Scope of Services and Budget for the Program to assist individuals and businesses impacted by COVID-19 who are facing potential eviction or foreclosure, more fully described in the Program Terms/Scope of Services and the Program Budget, attached hereto as Exhibit 2, is hereby approved. The eligibility criteria entitled "Residential Eviction and Foreclosure Prevention Program" and "Commercial Eviction and Foreclosure Prevention Program" is attached hereto as Exhibit 4.

Section 4. Invoking the exception to Section 126.107(g),

Ordinance Code. The City is hereby authorized to procure the use of the professional services of The Jacksonville Bar Association, Inc., to administer the Program. Pursuant to Section

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126.107(g) (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such procurement is exempted from competitive solicitation because the supplies or services are to be provided by those specifically prescribed within authorizing legislation that appropriates the same. With the exception of the foregoing, all other provisions of Chapter 126, Ordinance Code, shall remain in full force and effect. The Program Scope of Services and Budget more particularly described in Exhibit 2 designates specific services to be performed by The Jacksonville Bar Association, Inc., as a subrecipient/contractor for the City.

Section 5. Authorizations. The Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver on behalf of the City a Services Agreement for the Program, subject to the Scope of Services and Budget more particularly described in Exhibit 2, and all other contracts and documents, including extensions and amendments to the agreement, and otherwise take all necessary action to implement the Program , subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the General Counsel, or his or her designee, and the City's Risk Management Division for appropriate indemnification and insurance requirements.

Section 6. Oversight department. The Mayor's Office shall oversee the Program.

Compliance with applicable CARES Act Section 7. requirements. The Jacksonville Bar Association, Inc. will comply with all applicable CARES Act grant requirements in managing the Program, including but not limited to, the audit requirements attached hereto as Exhibit 3.

Section 8. Waiving Section 110.112, Ordinance Code. Section 110.112 (Advance of City funds; prohibition against), Part 1 (The City Treasury), Chapter 110 (City Treasury), Ordinance Code, is hereby waived to allow for advance payment for the Program.
