(c) Explanation of Appropriation

The funding above is an appropriation of Emergency Home Energy Assistance for the Elderly Program (EHEAP) Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act grant funds in the amount of \$124,544.00 to provide home energy assistance aid to eligible low income households with at least one member aged sixty (60) or over experiencing a heating or cooling emergency. There is no match for these funds.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide home energy assistance aid in an amount not to exceed \$2,000.00 per household for eligible households experiencing home energy heating or cooling emergencies during the period from August 1, 2020 through August 31, 2021. This funding is intended to cover instances where a home cooling or heating crisis exists, life-threatening or otherwise, as a result of financial and other hardships experienced by an eligible household due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Crisis assistance may include, but is not limited to, payment of delinquent utility bills, repairs or replacements to heating/cooling equipment, purchase of blankets, fans or other heating/cooling equipment, and temporary emergency shelter assistance.

Section 3. Approval and authorization. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver on behalf of the City the Emergency Home Energy Assistance for the Elderly

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grant.
