AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING A SMALL-SCALE AMENDMENT TO THE FUTURE LAND USE MAP SERIES OF THE 2030 COMPREHENSIVE PLAN BY CHANGING THE FUTURE LAND USE DESIGNATION FROM PUBLIC BUILDINGS AND FACILITIES (PBF) TO LOW DENSITY RESIDENTIAL (LDR) ON APPROXIMATELY 9.08± ACRES LOCATED IN COUNCIL DISTRICT 10 AT 4250 MATADOR DRIVE AND 4200 GEORGETOWN DRIVE, BETWEEN MATADOR DRIVE AND GEORGETOWN DRIVE, OWNED BY JOHN C. SHAVER AND THE CHURCH AT SUN COAST OF NORTH FLORIDA, INC., AS MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED HEREIN, PURSUANT TO APPLICATION NUMBER L-5467-20C; PROVIDING Α DISCLAIMER THAT THE AMENDMENT GRANTED HEREIN SHALL NOT BE CONSTRUED AS AN EXEMPTION FROM ANY OTHER APPLICABLE LAWS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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22 WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Section 650.402(b), 23 Ordinance Code, and Section 163.3187(1), Florida Statutes, an 24 application for a proposed Small-Scale Amendment to the Future Land Use Map series (FLUMs) of the 2030 Comprehensive Plan to change the 25 26 Future Land Use designation from Public Buildings and Facilities 27 (PBF) to Low Density Residential (LDR) on 9.08± acres of certain real property in Council District 10, was filed by Steve Diebenow, Esq., 28 29 on behalf of the owners, John C. Shaver and The Church at Sun Coast 30 of North Florida, Inc.; and

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WHEREAS, the Planning and Development Department reviewed the

proposed revision and application and has prepared a written report and rendered an advisory recommendation to the City Council with respect to the proposed amendment; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission, acting as the Local Planning Agency (LPA), held a public hearing on this proposed amendment, with due public notice having been provided, reviewed and considered comments received during the public hearing and made its recommendation to the City Council; and

9 WHEREAS, the Land Use and Zoning (LUZ) Committee of the City 10 Council held a public hearing on this proposed amendment to the 2030 11 Comprehensive Plan, pursuant to Chapter 650, Part 4, Ordinance Code, 12 considered all written and oral comments received during the public 13 hearing, and has made its recommendation to the City Council; and

14 WHEREAS, the City Council held a public hearing on this proposed amendment, with public notice having been provided, pursuant to 15 16 Section 163.3187, Florida Statutes and Chapter 650, Part 4, Ordinance Code, and considered all oral and written comments received during 17 public hearings, including the data and analysis portions of this 18 19 proposed amendment to the 2030 Comprehensive Plan and the recommendations of the Planning and Development Department, 20 the 21 Planning Commission and the LUZ Committee; and

22 WHEREAS, in the exercise of its authority, the City Council has 23 determined it necessary and desirable to adopt this proposed amendment 24 to the 2030 Comprehensive Plan to preserve and enhance present advantages, encourage the most appropriate use of land, water, and 25 26 resources consistent with the public interest, overcome present 27 deficiencies, and deal effectively with future problems which may result from the use and development of land within the City of 28 29 Jacksonville; now, therefore

30BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:31Section 1.Purpose and Intent.This Ordinance is adopted

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1 to carry out the purpose and intent of, and exercise the authority 2 set out in, the Community Planning Act, Sections 163.3161 through 3 163.3248, *Florida Statutes*, and Chapter 166, *Florida Statutes*, as 4 amended.

Subject Property Location and Description. 5 Section 2. The approximately 9.08± acres (R.E. Nos. 013930-0602 (portion) 6 and 7 013930-1000) are located in Council District 10 at 4250 Matador Drive and 4200 Georgetown Drive, between Matador Drive and Georgetown Drive, 8 9 as more particularly described in **Exhibit 1**, dated September 23, 2020, and graphically depicted in Exhibit 2, both attached hereto and 10 incorporated herein by this reference (Subject Property). 11

Section 3. Owner and Applicant Description. The Subject Property is owned by John C. Shaver and The Church at Sun Coast of North Florida, Inc. The applicant is Steve Diebenow, Esq., One Independent Drive, Suite 1200, Jacksonville, Florida 32202; (904) 807-8211.

17 Section 4. Adoption of Small-Scale Land Use Amendment. The 18 City Council hereby adopts a proposed Small-Scale revision to the 19 Future Land Use Map series of the 2030 Comprehensive Plan by changing 20 the Future Land Use Map designation from Public Buildings and 21 Facilities (PBF) to Low Density Residential (LDR), pursuant to 22 Application Number L-5467-20C.

23 Applicability, Effect and Legal Status. Section 5. The 24 applicability and effect of the 2030 Comprehensive Plan, as herein 25 amended, shall be as provided in the Community Planning Act, Sections 26 163.3161 through 163.3248, Florida Statutes, and this Ordinance. All 27 development undertaken by, and all actions taken in regard to development orders by governmental agencies in regard to land which 28 is subject to the 2030 Comprehensive Plan, as herein amended, shall 29 be consistent therewith as of the effective date of this amendment 30 31 to the plan.

Section 6.

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Effective date of this Plan Amendment.

(a) If the amendment meets the criteria of Section 163.3187,
Florida Statutes, as amended, and is not challenged, the effective
date of this plan amendment shall be thirty-one (31) days after
adoption.

6 (b) If challenged within thirty (30) days after adoption, the 7 plan amendment shall not become effective until the state land 8 planning agency or the Administration Commission, respectively, 9 issues a final order determining the adopted Small-Scale Amendment 10 to be in compliance.

Disclaimer. The amendment granted herein shall 11 Section 7. not be construed as an exemption from any other applicable local, 12 state, or federal laws, regulations, requirements, permits or 13 14 approvals. All other applicable local, state or federal permits or 15 approvals shall be obtained before commencement of the development 16 or use and issuance of this amendment is based upon acknowledgement, 17 representation and confirmation made by the applicant(s), owner(s), 18 developer(s) and/or any authorized agent(s) or designee(s) that the subject business, development and/or use will be operated in strict 19 20 compliance with all laws. Issuance of this amendment does not approve, 21 promote or condone any practice or act that is prohibited or restricted by any federal, state or local laws. 22

23 Section 8. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become 24 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 25 without the Mayor's signature.
