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RESOLUTION 2020-769-A

A RESOLUTION URGING THE U.S. CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION TO INCLUDE FIRST RESPONDERS IN THEINITIAL GROUP TO RECEIVE THE COVID-19 VACCINE DISTRIBUTION WHEN THE VACCINE IS APPROVED BY THE FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION ("FDA") AND FIRST MADE AVAILABLE; REQUESTING EMERGENCY ACTION INTRODUCTION; DIRECTION TO THELEGISLATIVE SERVICES DIVISION UPON ADOPTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, during 2020 the United States and the rest of the world have been ravaged by the novel coronavirus first identified in late 2019 (COVID-19), which has infected scores of millions of people worldwide and has killed over 1.5 million, a figure which is growing steadily as the pandemic shows no sign of abating; and

WHEREAS, in a truly remarkable display of skill and speed, scientists and medical researchers have developed, tested, and submitted for regulatory approval several vaccines to immunize against COVID-19 in less than one year; and

WHEREAS, as the vaccine is approved by the Food and Drug Administration ("FDA") and becomes ready for distribution,

hopefully within the next month, decisions must be made about prioritizing the initial distribution of limited supplies of the vaccine to those most in need of its protective power; and

WHEREAS, the initial information released by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) indicates that the first round of vaccinations will be administered to medical professionals (doctors, nurses, etc.), the residents and staff of congregate living facilities such as nursing homes and long-term assisted living facilities, and to those over the age of 65 with serious underlying health issues; and

WHEREAS, this initial prioritization list does not include first-responder emergency medical technicians as health care providers, despite the fact that they are on the front line of response to medical emergencies and therefore are highly susceptible to being exposed to the COVID-19 virus in the course of examining, treating and transporting their patients; and

WHEREAS, the loss of front line EMTs to COVID-related illness or quarantine due to potential exposure, as has happened around the country and in Jacksonville, endangers the health and safety of the general public by reducing the capacity of first responders to reach, evaluate, treat and transport sick or injured persons in a timely manner due to their reduced numbers; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City of Jacksonville hereby calls upon the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to include first-responder emergency medical technicians as health care providers in the top priority category of eligibility for receipt of the COVID-19 vaccine as soon as it is approved by the Food and Drug Administration ("FDA") for use in the United States, which is in the best interests of maintaining the capacity of the nation's emergency response system to meet COVID-related and all other types

of medical emergencies.

Section 2. Requesting emergency passage upon introduction pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. Emergency passage upon introduction of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that the COVID-19 vaccine is apparently nearing federal government approval for use and the City Council, with a December meeting hiatus taking effect next week, wishes to make known to the appropriate authorities as quickly as possible its feelings regarding this matter before distribution priorities are finalized and vaccinations begin, hopefully in the month of January 2021.

Section 3. Direction to Legislative Services Division.

The Chief of the Legislative Services Division is directed to forward copies of this adopted resolution to the Director of the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
