AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 30 (PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT), PART 1 (ORGANIZATION), SECTION 30.101 (ESTABLISHMENT; DIRECTOR OF THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT), SECTION 30.102 (RESERVED), SECTION 30.103 (DEFINITIONS), AND SECTION 30.104 (FUNCTIONS), TO CREATE THE OFFICE OF RESILIENCY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, at the December 1, 2020 Rules Committee meeting, the 15 16 Administration agreed to the codification of the Chief Resiliency 17 Officer position as an Office reporting to the Director of the 18 Planning and Development Department, which is organized within the 19 Executive Branch in Chapter 30 of the Ordinance Code; and

20 WHEREAS, the Rules Committee substitute to Ordinance 2020-672 21 reflects the action of the Finance Committee and the acquiescence 22 of the Administration to the same, now, therefore

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BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

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Section 1. Amending Chapter 30 (Planning and Development 26 27 Department), Part 1 (Organization), Sections 30.101 (Establishment; 28 Director of the Planning and Development Department), Section 29 30.102 (Reserved), 30.103 (Definitions), and Section 30.104 30 (Functions), Ordinance Code. Chapter 30 (PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

1 DEPARTMENT), Part 1 (Organization), is hereby amended to read as 2 follows:

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CHAPTER 30. PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT.

PART 1. ORGANIZATION

Sec. 30.101. - Establishment; Director of the Planning and Development Department.

7 There is established an executive department to be known as 8 the Planning and Development Department (hereinafter referred to in 9 this chapter as "Department") which shall be responsible for: the 10 activities of the Consolidated Government, ; for planning 11 administering and interpreting the Comprehensive Plan and the 12 Zoning Code_{τ}; for assisting and making recommendations to the 13 Council with respect to zoning matters; τ for considering and making recommendations to the Planning Commission upon requests 14 for 15 exceptions, variances, and waivers to the Zoning Code,; for granting administrative deviations to 16 the Zoning Code; and 17 coordinating and developing Jacksonville's Resiliency Strategy across all departments and with affiliated agencies; and 18 for assisting with the reapportionment of Council districts as required 19 by the Charter or as requested by the Council. The head of the 20 21 Department shall be the Director of the Planning and Development 22 Department (hereinafter referred to in this chapter as Director) 23 who shall be appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the Council 24 and shall serve at the pleasure of the Mayor. The Director shall 25 have a master's degree from an accredited college or university, in 26 public administration, urban planning or a related field or shall 27 have ten year's professional and administrative experience in a 28 managerial capacity, at least five of which shall be in an urban planning or a related field or shall have ten years' professional 29 and administrative experience in a managerial capacity, at least 30 five of which shall be in an urban planning agency or organization. 31

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Furthermore, the Department shall provide coordination, expertise and assistance in the furtherance of economic development within the City, and the Director shall directly report to the Chief Services Officer.

Office of Resiliency; 5 Section 30.102. - Reserved. Establishment; Responsibilities; Chief Resiliency Officer. 6 7 There is established within the Department an Office of 8 Resiliency, which shall be responsible for: 9 The coordination, development, refinement, (a) administration, integration, and communication 10 of 11 resilience policies and practices for the City; The development and coordination of Jacksonville's 12 (b) Resiliency Strategy across all departments; and 13 (c) Overseeing the coordination of high-priority resiliency 14 15 projects, including securing funding for resiliency initiatives, monitoring, and reporting progress on those 16 17 projects. Within the Office of Resiliency, a full-time position of the 18 Chief Resiliency Officer ("CRO") is hereby created, which shall 19 operate under the authority of, and report directly to, the 20 21 Director of the Planning and Development Department. The CRO 22 shall be appointed by the Mayor and approved by the Council and 23 shall serve at the pleasure of the Mayor. The CRO shall serve as 24 the chief liaison for all City operations relating to resiliency 25 and shall be responsible to the Director for the development and 26 coordination of Jacksonville's Resiliency Strategy across all 27 departments. The CRO shall meet the following minimum qualifications: a master's degree or higher, from an accredited 28 college or university, in engineering, environmental sciences, 29 biology, sustainability, planning, or a closely related field; and 30 31 four (4) years of progressively responsible professional work

experience in sustainability planning, resiliency planning, or a 1 2 related field. 3 Sec. 30.103. - Definitions. In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires: 4 5 City means the City of Jacksonville, excluding the (a) Second, Third, Fourth and Fifth Urban Services Districts, 6 7 except as to county planning functions. 8 (b) General location means area or neighborhood to be served, 9 but not site specific. Long-range plans means plans which define needs from five 10 (c) 11 years to ten years. Resiliency Strategy means the plan developed by the City for 12 creating the projects, programs, funding, management, 13 and implementation goals for a resilient Jacksonville. 14 15 (d) Short-range plans mean plans, which define needs for 16 three to five years. Sec. 30.104. - Functions. 17 18 The Department shall: (a) Conduct research studies, collect, compile and analyze 19 20 socioeconomic data and prepare maps, charts and tables 21 necessary for the accomplishment of its other functions 22 and for use by governmental and private entities. 23 24 Coordinate with the Downtown Investment Authority Chief (Z) 25 Executive Officer regarding planning, permitting and 26 development Downtown. Such areas shall include, but not 27 limited to, the Historic Preservation Section, be 28 Development Services, Development of Regional Impact 29 Coordinator, and the Bicycle/Pedestrian Coordinator. (aa) Coordinate, develop, refine, and integrate the resilience 30 31 policies and practices for the City.

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1	(bb) Develop and coordinate the City's Resiliency Strategy
2	across all departments.
3	(cc) Coordinate high-priority resilience projects, including
4	securing funding for resiliency initiatives, monitoring,
5	and reporting progress on those projects.
6	Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become
7	effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
8	without the Mayor's signature.
